

Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing		
Urban/ Poor Drainage Flooding	Flooding of creeks, streams, urban areas, and poor drainage areas. Water may cover roads, especially in low lying areas.	Eastern New York and western New England	Thursday night into Friday night		
River Flooding	Minor flooding is forecast along several area rivers. Roads and structures near these rivers may flood.	Eastern New York and western New England	Friday into Saturday		
Strong Wind	Downed tree limbs, possibly resulting in isolated power outages.	Mainly above 2000' elevation in eastern New York and western New England	Late Thursday night into Friday evening

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



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






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Maximum Wind Gusts Valid: Thursday night through Friday evening



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
Forecast Wind Gusts

- Strongest winds expected late Thursday night into Friday evening
- ✓ Winds could gust to 50 mph across the higher terrain mainly above 2000'

Event Summary

ONAL WEATHER SERVICE

- A low pressure system will bring widespread moderate to locally heavy rainfall to eastern New York and western New England Thursday night into Friday night. Rainfall amounts are expected to range from 1 to 2.5 inches, locally higher across the southeastern-facing slopes of the Catskills, Greens, and Berkshires. This rainfall, combined with high-elevation snowmelt, may result in minor river flooding and urban/poor drainage flooding. River flooding may persist into Saturday.
- Windy conditions are expected across the higher terrain, especially above 2000' elevation. Wind gusts of 40 to 50 mph are possible.
- There is a slight chance of thunderstorms Friday afternoon.
- Confidence is moderate for flooding and low for high winds.









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
