




Wintry Mixed Precipitation

Decision Support Briefing #1 As of: 5 PM **December 26, 2018**

What Has Changed?

Winter Weather Advisories have been issued for much of eastern NY and western New England for Thursday night into Friday morning.













Hazard Location **Timing Impacts** Northern portions of the Mid-Hudson valley, Total snow and sleet eastern Catskills, accumulation a coating to up to Schoharie Valley, an inch in a few spots central and northern Snow/Sleet **Taconics, Mohawk** Untreated roads will become Valley, the Greater slick and hazardous Capital Region, southern Adirondacks, Lake George-Saratoga Region, Berkshires and southern Vermont Up to one tenth of an inch (0.1 Northern portions of the inches) of ice accumulation in Mid-Hudson valley,



most locations, except up to one quarter inch is possible over portions of the Mohawk Valley, southwest Adirondacks, and southern VT

Untreated roads will become slick and hazardous

Isolated power outages possible

eastern Catskills, Schoharie Valley, central and northern Taconics, Mohawk Valley, the Greater Capital Region, southern Adirondacks, Lake George-Saratoga Region, Berkshires and

southern Vermont

Precipitation begins between 1 am and 4 am Friday morning across the entire area

Mixed precipitation will continue through the Friday morning commute transitioning to rain between 9 am and noon

Snow, and sleet will quickly transition to freezing rain in the mid to late morning across the advisory area

Freezing rain will continue in some locations until noon on **Friday**


























Probabilistic Snowfall Forecast


Expected Snowfall

High End Amount




























Impacts and Timing:

Timing: Precipitation begins from west to east over eastern New York and western New England in the advisory area between 1 am and 4 am, quickly transitioning to freezing rain by the mid to late morning, and then plain rain between 9 am and noon on Friday.

Impacts: Slippery surfaces including roadways and sidewalks. Light freezing rain, snow and sleet accumulations on exposed surfaces will lead to slippery conditions. Isolated power outages are possible.









Event Summary

Mixed precipitation including snow, sleet and freezing rain late Thursday night until noon Friday

- ✓ Confidence is HIGH that this event will occur and Moderate on travel impacts Friday. morning
 - Slippery road conditions are likely on untreated roads that will impact the morning commute
 - Isolated power outages are possible
- ✓ **Period of greatest impact:** Friday morning until noontime
- Winter Weather Advisories:
 - 1 AM Friday 9 AM Friday: The eastern Catskills, Schoharie Valley, northern portions of the mid Hudson Valley, the Greater Capital Region, eastern Mohawk Valley, central and southern Taconics and the Berkshires of western Massachusetts
 - 1 AM Friday Noon Friday: The western and central Mohawk Valley, southern Adirondacks, the Lake George and Saratoga Region, and southern Vermont.
