- High Wind Watch converted to Wind Advisory for the Berkshires















## Probabilistic Snowfall Forecast



## Forecast Snowfall





Ice accretion may lead to hazardous travel conditions this evening into early Tuesday morning














### Low Temperatures

✓ Wind gusts up to 50 mph Tuesday could result in downed trees, tree limbs and isolated to scattered power outages



## **Mixed Precipitation Event Summary**

- Precipitation is expected to overspread eastern NY and western New England late this afternoon into this evening. It will begin as a wintry mix of snow, sleet and freezing rain for the southern Adirondacks, Upper Hudson Valley, western Mohawk Valley, southern VT and the Berkshires. We have issued a Winter Weather Advisory for these areas due to the potential of snow, sleet and ice accumulations.
- Period of greatest impact: 5 pm tonight through 5 am Tuesday morning. Slippery travel conditions are possible due to snow, sleet and ice accumulations.
- Temperatures should be in the low to mid 30s in the Winter Weather Advisory areas as precipitation arrives which should allow for a coating to up to 2 inches of snow and sleet to accumulate as well as up to a tenth of an inch of ice. Temperatures should gradually warm overnight allowing wintry mix to transition to plain rain.
- Confidence is **HIGH** that this event will occur and **MODERATE** on the expected impacts.










# **Strong Winds Event Summary**

- ✓ Winds are expected to gust up to 50 mph Tuesday in the Mohawk Valley, Capital. District, Schoharie Valley, eastern Catskills, Helderbergs, Mid-Hudson Valley, Taconics, southern Green Mountains, Litchfield Hills and Berkshires. A Wind Advisory has been issued for these areas.
- Period of greatest impact: **Tuesday 6 AM to 4 PM**. Downed trees and tree limbs, possibly resulting in isolated to scattered power outages.
- Confidence is HIGH that winds gusting above 45 mph will occur and **MODERATE** that gusts will reach 50 to 60 mph.












