

Snow & Ice		Slippery road conditions due to snow accumulating a coating to 2 inches and a glaze to less than a tenth of an inch of ice from freezing rain.	Glaze of ice expected across eastern New York and western New England	Into Today


























## Additional moderate to heavy snowfall possible tonight into Thursday

#### **Impacts and Timing:**

✓ Moderate to heavy snowfall over a long duration from tonight into Thursday is possible, mainly across the western Mohawk Valley, western & southern Adirondacks, southern Green Mountains, and northern Berkshires, Additional winter headlines are likely to be issued.









## **Event Summary**

Snow and wintry mix into today, moderate to heavy snow for some areas tonight into Thursday....

> Winter Weather Advisory remains in effect for all of eastern New York and western New England



Greatest snowfall will be across western Adirondacks, where 2 to 4 inches of storm total snowfall is expected. Hazardous travel conditions into today, including the morning commute.



Wintry mix, including areas of light snow, sleet and freezing rain continue for eastern New York and western New England. Storm totals of a coating to 2 inches of snow and a coating to less than a tenth of an inch of ice are expected. This will result in areas of hazardous travel into today, including the morning commute.



Additional moderate to heavy snowfall is possible across the western Mohawk Valley, western & southern Adirondacks, southern Green Mountains, and northern Berkshires tonight into Thursday.
