- ✓ Majority of snow has ended. Wind Chill Warnings and Advisories in Effect 6 PM Sunday through 6 PM Monday.

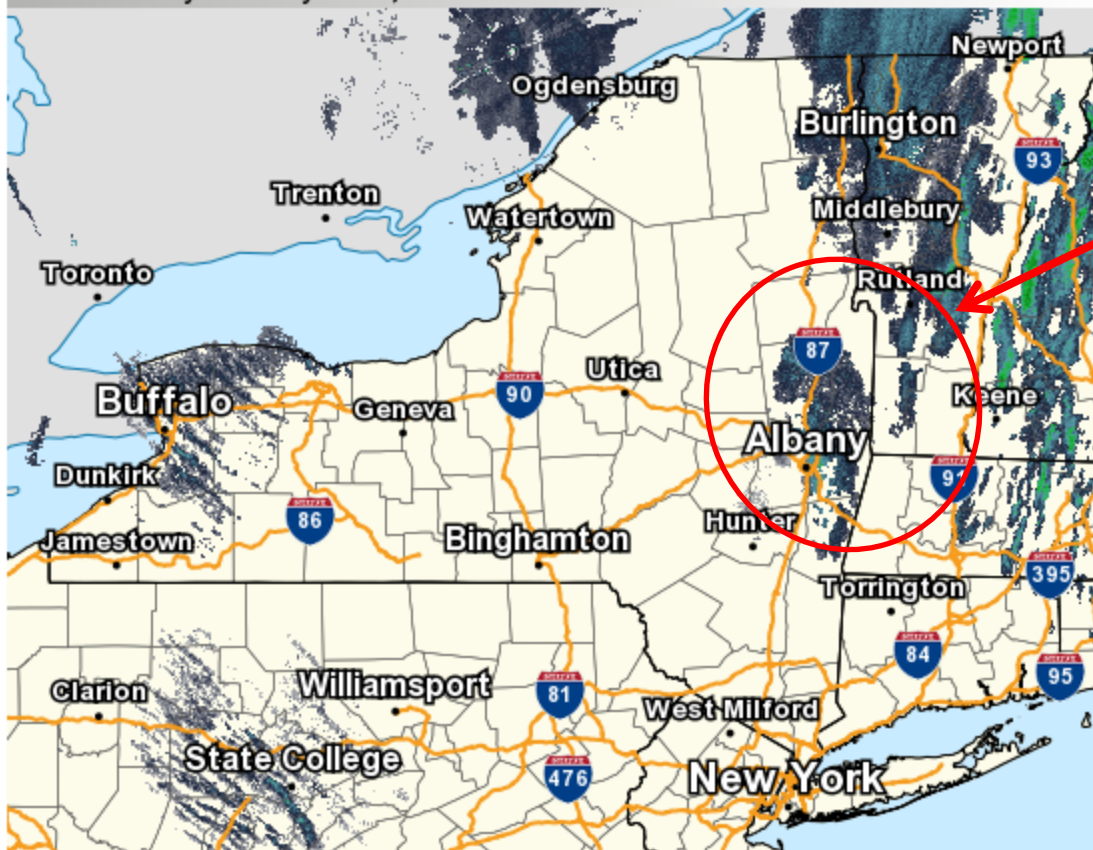
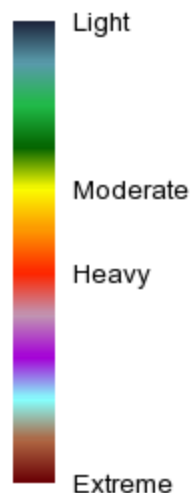


Weather Radar at 4:50 PM

Some light snow lingers for a couple of hours this evening.

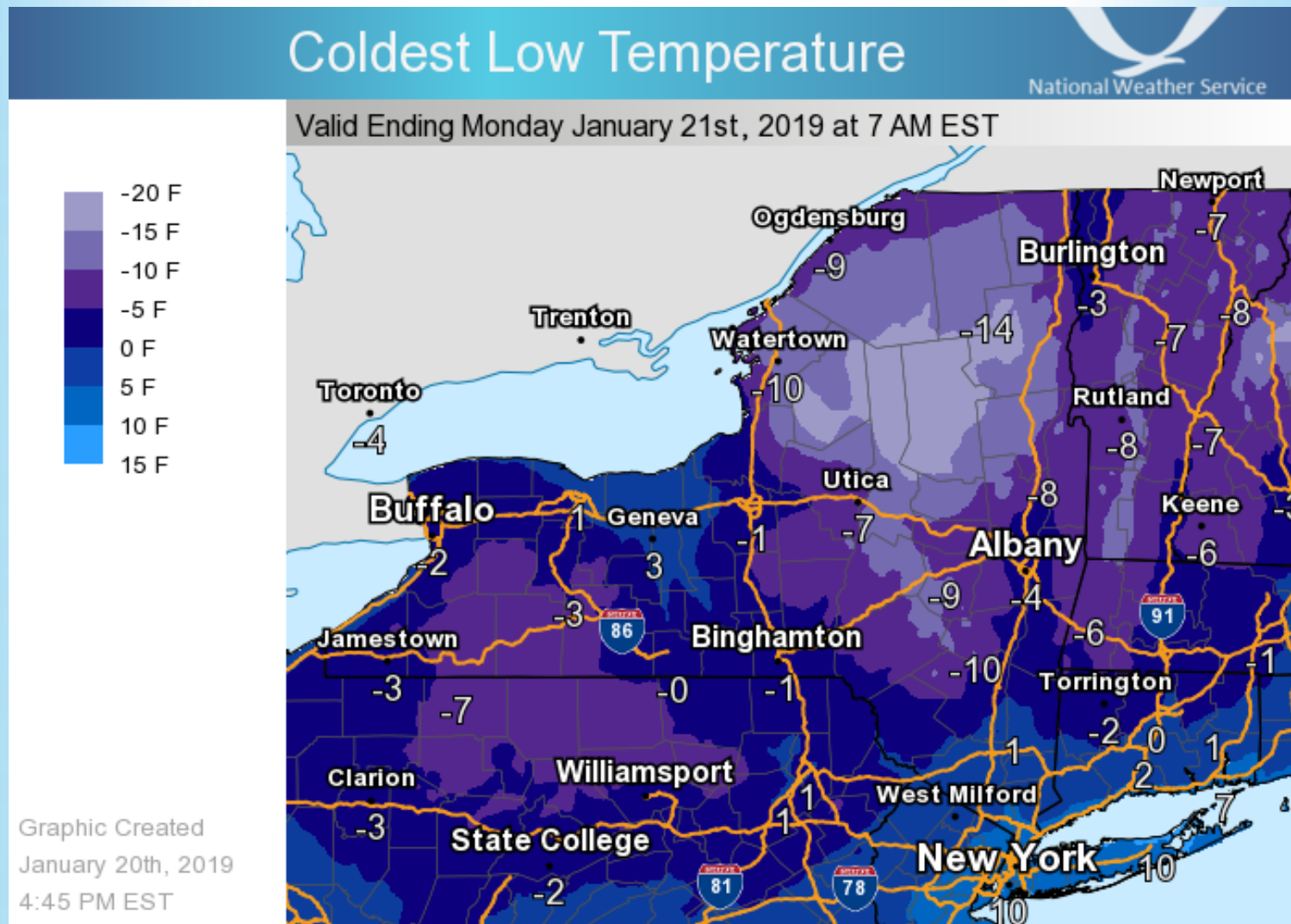

Main Points

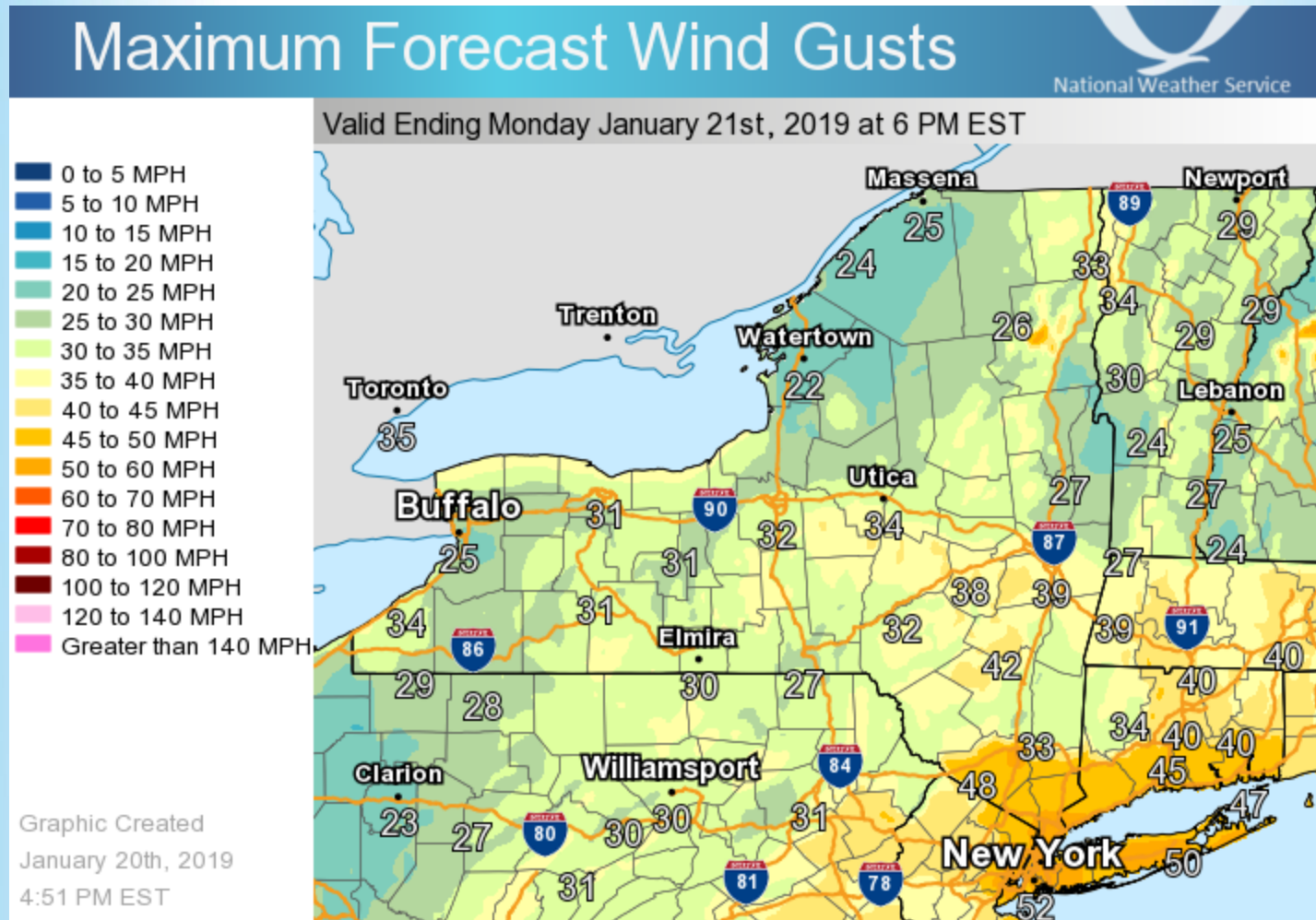
Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Blowing Snow 	Blowing and drifting snow that may re-cover cleared roadways and sidewalks. Also, localized reduced visibility.	Eastern New York and western New England	This evening into Monday
Wind Chill 	Increased risk for frostbite and hypothermia.	Eastern New York and western New England	This evening through Monday night

Maximum Wind Gusts Tonight Through Monday

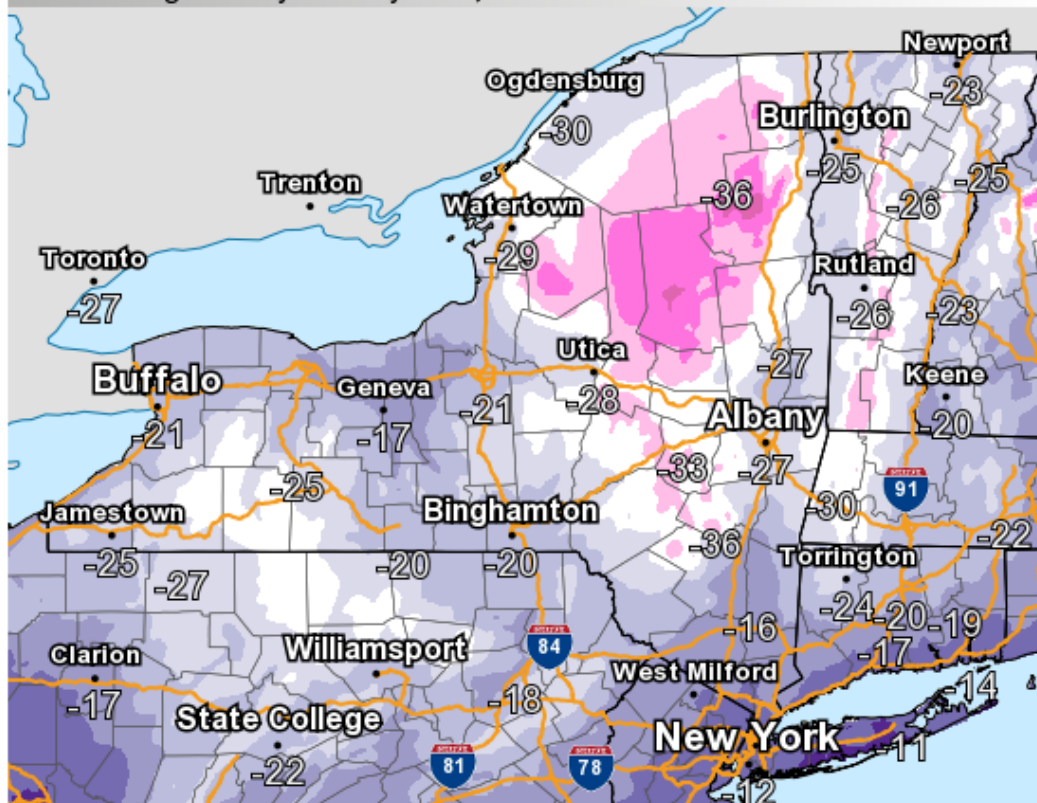
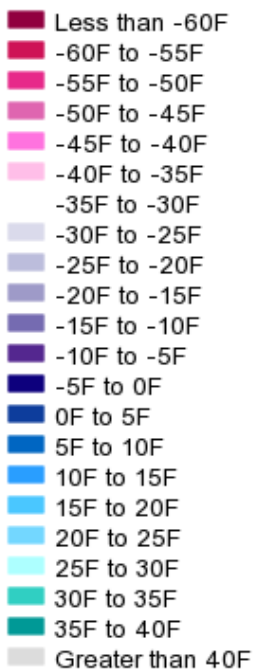


Coldest Wind Chills Tonight Through Monday

Impacts:

- ✓ **Life-Threatening** Wind Chills of -15 to -40 degrees possible tonight and Monday.
- ✓ Frostbite and hypothermia can occur to exposed skin in 10 to 30 minutes.

Event Summary – Dangerous Wind Chills

- ✓ Confidence is **HIGH** that this event will occur and **HIGH** on expected impacts
- ✓ Period of greatest impact: This evening through Monday evening for Dangerous Cold



Snowfall has mostly ended. Some light additional accumulation possible for the next couple of hours across the Saratoga Region, Capital District, northern Taconics, southern Vermont and Berkshire County, Mass.



Gusty winds through tonight may lead to areas of blowing and drifting snow resulting in reduced visibilities and snow covered roadways.

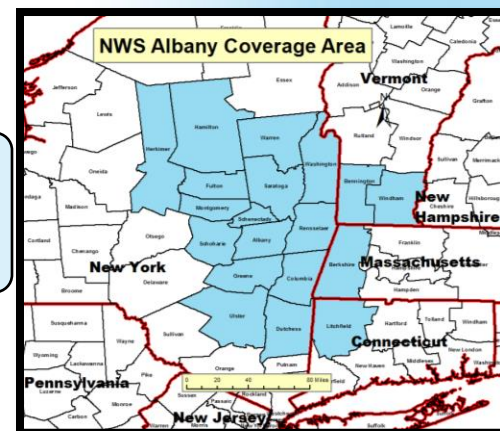


Life-threatening wind chills expected tonight through Monday evening which would result in increased risk of hypothermia and frostbite.
