





Hazard		Impacts	Location	Timing
Wind	-	Downed large tree limbs and a few trees. Isolated to scattered power outages are possible.	Most of eastern New York and western New England	Until 3 PM Saturday
Snow	*	Slippery road conditions due to 2-5 inches of snow. Blowing snow due to gusty winds 40 to 50 mph	Northern Herkimer County	Until 1 PM Saturday
Snow	**	Slippery road conditions due to 3 to 6 inches of snow. Blowing snow due to gusty winds 40 to 50 mph	Southern Herkimer County	7 pm Friday to 1 pm Saturday






Probabilistic Snowfall Forecast


Expected Snowfall





Wind and Winter Weather Advisories – Event Summary

IONAL WEATHER SERVICE

- Confidence is HIGH that winds will gust greater than 45 MPH across most of eastern New York and western New England
- ✓ Confidence is **MODERATE** that snow will accumulate 3-6 inches over Herkimer county
- ✓ West winds are expected to gust to 40-50 mph tonight into Saturday afternoon across eastern New York (excluding the Mid Hudson Valley) and western New England.
- Period of greatest impact (*wind*): Tonight to Saturday 3 PM. Downed large tree limbs and a few trees are possible. Some isolated to scattered power outages may occur.
- Period of greatest impact (*snow*): Tonight to Saturday 1 PM. 3-6 inches of snow expected with difficult travel conditions due to snow and blowing snow in some areas.


