




















Impacts and Timing:

- Strong to damaging westerly winds will continue into this evening. Wind gusts up to 65 mph are expected across eastern NY & western New England.
- ✓ The strong winds will likely down large tree limbs and some trees, resulting in scattered to widespread power outages.









Probabilistic Snowfall Forecast – Lake Effect

Event Summary

Strong to damaging winds & lake effect snow through this evening

- ✓ Confidence is HIGH that this event will occur and MODERATE-HIGH on expected impacts
- Period of greatest impact: This morning into the evening hours for strong to damaging winds & lake effect snow.



Winter Weather Advisory (Through This Evening): Herkimer, Hamilton and northern **Fulton Counties**

Lake effect snow will accumulate 2 to 6 inches, with isolated 8 inches, the greatest total across central and southern Herkimer County. Strong winds will cause blowing and drifting snow. Visibility will be significantly reduced across the area and travel will be hazardous due to the low visibility & snow covered roadways.



High Wind Warning (Through This Evening): All of eastern New York and western New **England**

Strong to damaging westerly winds of up to 65 mph will result in downed large tree limbs and trees & scattered to widespread power outages.


