Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Snow	Potential for 7 inches or more of wet snow resulting in hazardous travel including during the Friday morning and evening commutes The combination of potential heavy, wet snow and winds gusting to 45 mph could result in isolated to scattered power outages	Herkimer, Hamilton, northern Fulton, northern Warren, Schoharie, Bennington, and western Windham Counties	Early Friday morning into Saturday
Wind 90	The potential for winds gusting around 45 mph could result in isolated power outages	Eastern NY and western New England	Friday night into Saturday








### **Probabilistic Snowfall Forecast**

# **Event Summary**

#### Winter Storm Watch in Effect Friday morning to noon Saturday:

ONAL WEATHER SERVICE

WHERE: Herkimer, Hamilton, Schoharie, northern Fulton, northern Warren, Bennington, and western Windham Counties



- WHAT: Rain today will mix with and change to snow tonight into Friday morning. The snow will be wet and may be heavy at times Friday into Friday night with potential accumulations of at least 7 inches. The snow may result in hazardous travel conditions, including during the Friday morning and evening commutes.
- Outside of the Winter Storm Watch area, a moderate snowfall in excess of 4 inches is possible over the central Mohawk Valley, eastern Catskills, northern Taconics, and the northern Berkshires. A Winter Weather Advisory may be needed for these areas later.



- **ALSO:** Winds could gust to 45 mph across eastern New York and western New England Friday night into Saturday. If the potential for gusts in excess of 45 mph increases, a Wind Advisory will be needed. The combination of potential heavy, wet snow and winds gusting to 45 mph over the Winter Storm Watch area could result in isolated to scattered power outages.
- **CONFIDENCE:** Moderate on snowfall totals, wind gusts, and impacts.
