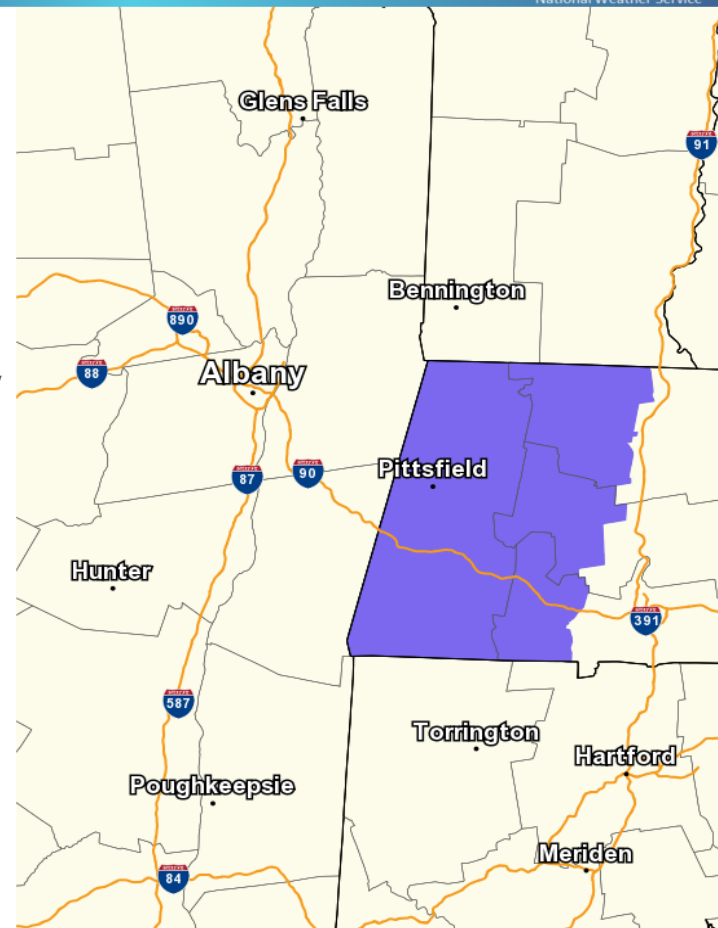

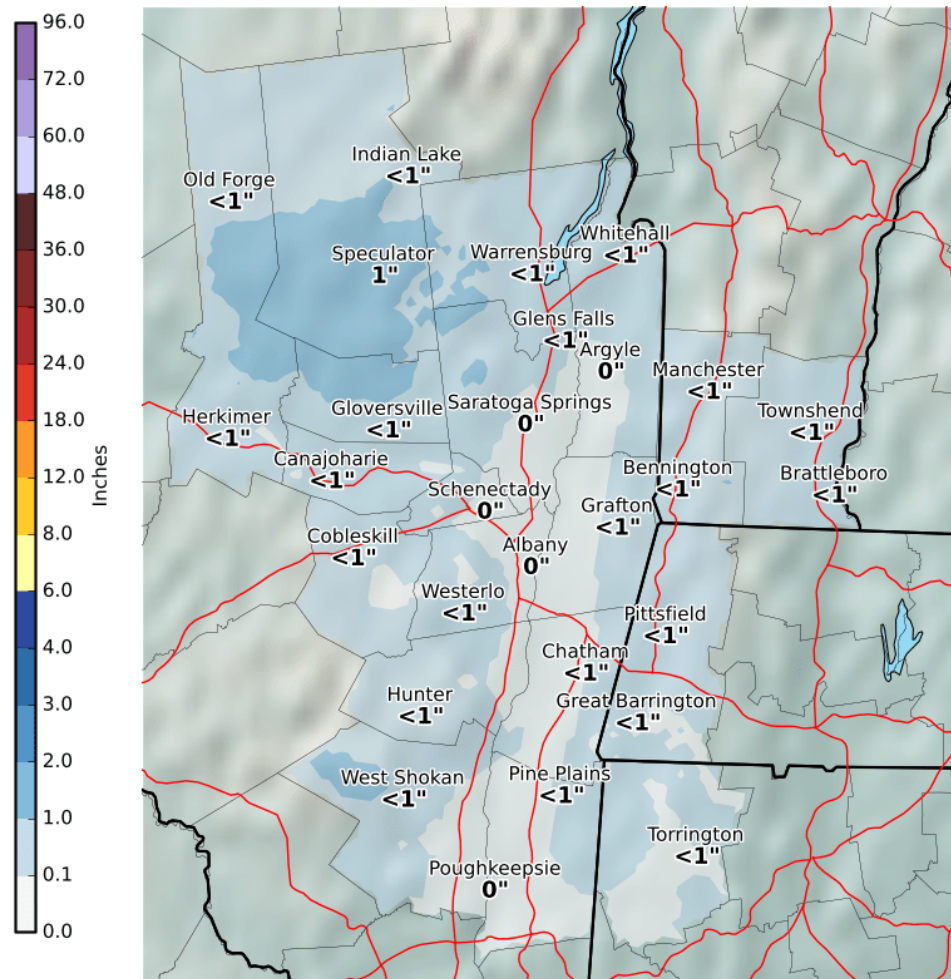

Valid: 04/05/2019 08:00 AM - 04/06/2019 08:00 AM

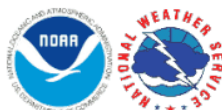


Timing

- A mixture of rain and snow is expected to develop this afternoon
- Minor accumulations possible mainly above 1000 feet elevation

Impacts

- Most higher elevations will have less than a ½ of an inch of snow, except locally up to 2 inches across the southwest Adirondacks

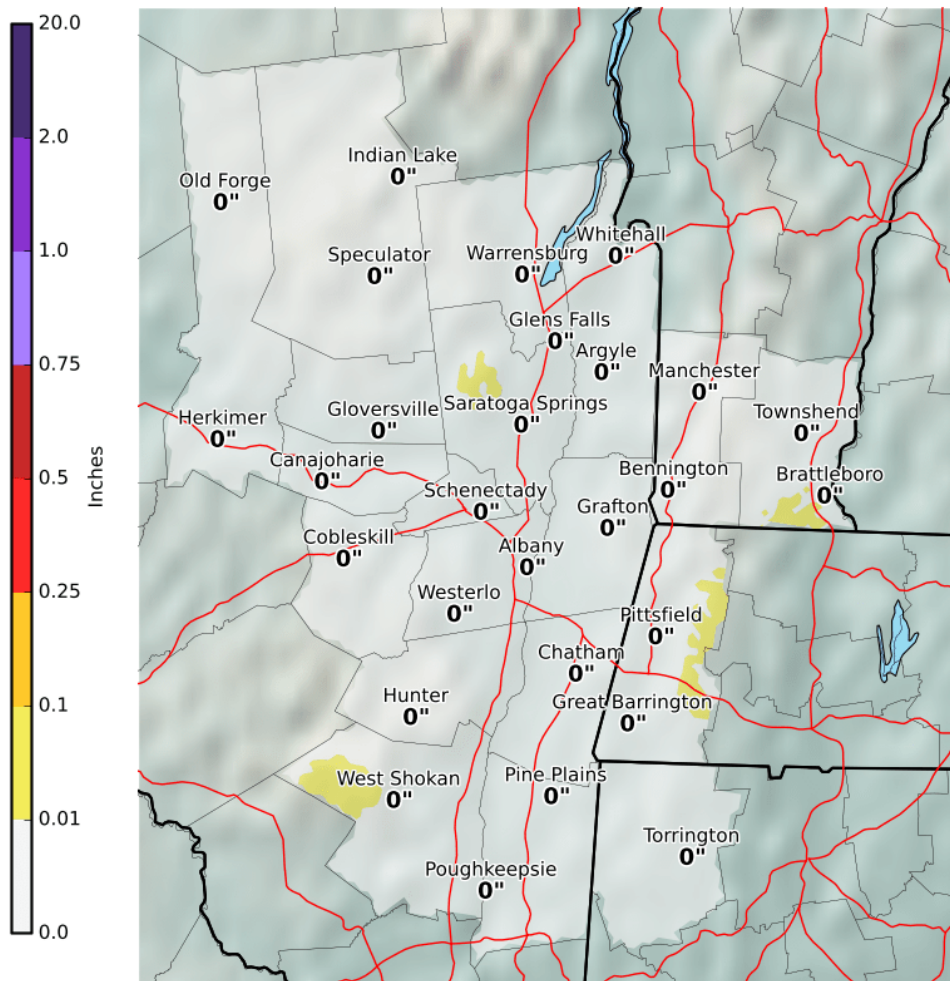

Timing

- As temperatures drop this evening, freezing rain will become likely across the Berkshires and is expected continue well into the overnight hours
- Spotty light freezing rain is also possible across elevations above 1000 feet in the Catskills, southern Vermont, the southern Adirondacks, and Litchfield Hills

Impacts

- Slippery travel conditions
- Light glaze of ice

Event Summary

- ✓ Confidence is **MODERATE** that this event will occur and **MODERATE** on expected impacts
- ✓ Period of greatest impact: This evening into the overnight hours



A mixture of rain and snow is expected to develop this afternoon with mainly less than a ½ of an inch of snow expected across higher elevations above 1000 feet, except locally up to 2 inches across the southwest Adirondacks.



As temperatures drop this evening, freezing rain will become likely across the Berkshires and is expected continue well into the overnight hours with slippery travel conditions developing with a light glaze of ice expected. Spotty freezing rain is also possible across higher elevations above 1000 feet across southern Vermont, the southern Adirondacks, Litchfield Hills and eastern Catskills.

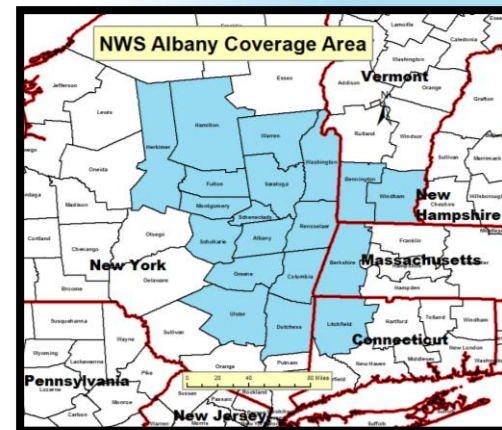
