


What Has Changed?

✓ Flash Flood Watch cancelled for Schoharie Valley, Capital District, and Helderbergs

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Active Flood Watches

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
Main	Points
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Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
River Flooding	Continued runoff due to overnight rainfall and snowmelt with already elevated water levels will result in continued significant river rises and minor to moderate flooding.	The southern Adirondacks, Lake George Region, Mohawk Valley, and southern Vermont.	Through Sunday
Flooding	Urban, low lying and poor drainage flooding is possible. Isolated flash flooding cannot be ruled out.	All of eastern New York and western New England, except the Schoharie Valley, Capital District, and Helderbergs	Through this afternoon














River Forecasts:




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Additional Forecast Rainfall **Amounts:** This morning through this evening




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Blue and purple areas marked on this map still contain hydrologically significant snowpack.

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As this snow melts, it will contribute to runoff and river rises this weekend.

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Day One Excessive Rainfall Outlook



8 AM Today through 8 am Sunday

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Probability that heavy rainfall will cause localized urban, poor drainage or small stream flooding within 25 miles of your location.



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Event Summary

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- Confidence is MODERATE that this event will occur and MODERATE on expected impacts
- ✓ Period of greatest impact for Flash Flooding: Through this morning
- ✓ Period of greatest impact for River Flooding: Through Sunday



Continued runoff due to overnight rainfall and snowmelt with already elevated water levels will result in continued significant river rises and minor to moderate flooding. River crests expected today and Sunday.



Urban, low lying, poor drainage flooding and isolated flash flooding is possible through this afternoon for all of the region, except the Schoharie Valley, Capital District, and Helderbergs.
