




Severe Thunderstorms Continue This Evening and will be possible again on Monday

What Has Changed?

✓ A portion of our area has been upgraded to a Slight Risk for Severe Weather Monday














Timing:

Some severe storms are possible Monday afternoon and evening, especially near and east of the Hudson River.

Impacts:

- Damaging straightline winds to 60 mph
- Isolated tree damage and power outages
- Isolated hail 1" in diameter is possible









Event Summary

Strong to Severe Thunderstorms Continue this Evening and will be Possible again on Monday Afternoon to Evening

- Confidence is moderate in terms of timing, location, and severity
- This Afternoon and Evening: Strong to severe thunderstorms will continue through this evening. The main threats will be damaging winds, hail up to 1" in diameter, and heavy rainfall.
- > Tonight Monday: Periods of showers and thunderstorms continue overnight into Monday. Isolated severe storms are possible Monday afternoon, especially near and east of the Hudson River. The main threats will be damaging winds, hail up to 1" in diameter and heavy rainfall.


