




Thunderstorms Likely Today into Monday - Some Could be Severe

What Has Changed? No changes












Timing:

- ✓ Chance of storms this morning (not severe).
- ✓ Additional storms expected this afternoon and evening. Some could be strong to severe especially west of the Hudson River.

Impacts:

- Damaging straightline winds to 60 mph
- Scattered tree damage and isolated power outages







storms possible




Timing:

- ✓ Periods of showers and thunderstorms continue tonight into Monday.
- Isolated severe storms are possible Monday afternoon and evening.

Impacts:

- Damaging straightline winds to 60 mph
- Isolated tree damage and isolated power outages
- Isolated 1" Hail Possible







Event Summary

A Few Rounds of Storms today into Monday, Some Could be Severe

- Confidence is low in terms of timing, location, and severity
- There is a chance of thunderstorms this morning. These storms are not expected to be severe.
- Additional storms may develop this afternoon into the evening. Some of these storms could be strong to severe, especially west of the Hudson River. The main threat is damaging wind to 60 mph.
- Periods of showers and thunderstorms will continue tonight into Monday. Isolated severe storms are possible Monday afternoon. The main threat will be damaging winds to 60 mph, but some 1" hail possible.


