





Tornado		Flying debris, mobile homes possibly destroyed, damage to roofs, windows and vehicles	All of eastern New York with greater confidence for areas west of the Hudson River.	Today mainly 3 pm to 10 pm
Hail		1 inch or greater in diameter that may result in damage to agriculture, windows, roofs	All of eastern New York with greater confidence for areas west of the Hudson River.	Today mainly 3 pm to 10 pm










Threats:


- Damaging winds
- ✓ Hail of 1" in diameter. or larger
- **Isolated Tornado**

Timing:

- This afternoon and evening (mainly 3 pm to 10 pm)

Probabilities for Severe Wind & Hail













Probability for Tornadoes











Severe Thunderstorm Watch - Severe thunderstorms are possible in and near the watch area. Stay informed and be ready to act if a severe thunderstorm warning is issued.

Severe Thunderstorm Warning - Severe weather has been reported by spotters or indicated by radar. Warnings indicate imminent danger to life and property.



A tornado WATCH means a tornado is possible.

A tornado WARNING means a tornado is already occurring or will occur soon. GO TO YOUR SAFE PLACE IMMEDIATELY.

Top Tip

Identify a safe place in your home where household members and pets will gather during severe weather: a basement, storm cellar or an interior room on the lowest floor with no windows. When Thunder Roars, Head Indoors! See a Flash, Dash Inside!









Event Summary

Strong to Severe Storms Possible This Afternoon and Evening (Main time window: 3 PM to 10 PM)

- ✓ Confidence is low-moderate for this event. Focus for severe storms expected to be mainly west of the Hudson River. We have less confidence for severe weather in western New England, but can't be ruled out.
- ✓ Period of greatest impact: This afternoon into the early evening (mainly 3 pm to 10 pm). Isolated to scattered thunderstorms are expected.
- Main impacts from any severe thunderstorms looks to be damaging winds. However, hail and even an isolated tornado can't be ruled out.











