




Severe Weather and Heavy Rainfall Threats This Weekend

What Has Changed? First briefing













Impacts:

Locally heavy rainfall leading to isolated flash flooding


Timing:

√ 4 pm to 10 pm

Location:

Mainly the Mohawk Valley, Capital District, Schoharie Valley, and eastern Catskills

Today's Excessive Rainfall Outlook














Impacts:

- Main threat: Damaging straightline winds
- Secondary threats: large hail, isolated tornadoes

Timing:

Sunday afternoon and evening











Event Summary

Thunderstorms Expected At Times This Weekend

- Confidence is moderate in terms of timing, location, and severity
- Scattered to numerous thunderstorms are expected to move in this afternoon and evening, although coverage will be more isolated over western New England. Rainfall could be locally heavy, leading to an isolated flash flood threat across the Mohawk Valley, Capital District, Schoharie Valley, and eastern Catskills between 4 pm and 10 pm.
- Another round of thunderstorms is expected Sunday afternoon and evening. There is a marginal to slight risk of severe weather, especially from the Capital District south and east. The main threat is damaging wind. Secondary threats are large hail and isolated tornadoes.
