


Heavy Rain, Severe Weather Threat & Dangerous Heat Conditions

What Has Changed?

- ✓ Severe weather threat increased from Marginal to Slight risk this afternoon into the early evening from the Capital District to southern Vermont, and points south




Main Points


Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Flooding 	Flooding of poor drainage and low lying areas and possibly leading to isolated flash flooding	Eastern New York and western New England	This afternoon and tonight
Wind 	Downed trees and power lines, and isolated structural damage associated with the strongest storms	The Capital District to southern Vermont and points south	This afternoon into the early evening
Heat 	Dangerous heat conditions and potential heat stroke	Eastern New York and western New England	Friday, Saturday & Sunday especially during the afternoon into the early evening hours

Valid: 07/17/2019 02:00 AM - 07/18/2019 08:00 AM EDT



Locally higher amounts are expected especially where stronger thunderstorms occur and in areas that get repeated rainfall

Impacts:


- ✓ Main threat:
Damaging wind gusts

Timing:

- ✓ This afternoon into the early evening

Location:

- ✓ Capital District to southern Vermont and points south



Dangerous Heat Conditions

Friday, Saturday & Sunday


HEAT ADVISORY is issued when dangerous heat conditions are expected.

- Heat Indices of 95 degrees or more for two or more consecutive hours for New York State excluding the Lower Hudson Valley, New York City & Long Island and for Vermont.
- Heat Indices of 95-99 degrees for 2 consecutive days or 100 to 104 degrees for any duration in New York State for the Lower Hudson Valley, New York City & Long Island and for Connecticut & Massachusetts.

EXCESSIVE HEAT WARNING is issued when extremely dangerous heat conditions are expected.

Specifically for heat indices of 105+ degrees for two or more hours for New York State, Connecticut, Massachusetts and Vermont.



Event Summary

Today and tonight: Showers and thunderstorms will become widespread this afternoon as a cold front approaches and tropical moisture moves across the area.

- ✓ Confidence:
 - ✓ Heavy Rainfall: Moderate
 - ✓ Severe Weather Threat: Low



Thunderstorms will contain locally heavy rainfall, which may produce isolated flash flooding, especially where multiple thunderstorms occur.



There is a marginal to slight risk of severe weather mainly from the Capital District to southern Vermont and points south this afternoon into the early evening. The main threat is damaging wind gusts.

Friday, Saturday & Sunday: Hot temperatures combined with high humidity levels are expected creating dangerous heat conditions. Heat Advisories and/or Excessive Heat Warnings may be needed.
