

Flooding		Heavy rain will result in rises on creeks and streams with some rivers expected to reach flood stage. High rainfall rates may result in poor drainage flooding in urban and low lying areas. Strong Winds		South-Southwest winds becoming westerly. Sustained between 15 to 25 mph with gusts up to 50 mph.	All of eastern New York and western New England	Wind Advisory in effect: 5PM Thurs Oct 31 to 8PM Fri Nov 1, 2019. Strongest wind gusts expected between 2AM and 2PM Friday Nov 1.












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#### **Storm Total Rainfall:**

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
- ✓ Between 1AM Thurs Oct 31 and 8AM Fri Nov 1, 2019
- ✓ 1–3 inches expected with isolated higher amounts possible in the Adirondacks, Catskills & southern Greens.



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River Points Expected to Reach Flood Stage

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- Until Nov 5, 2019
- Points in orange expected to reach minor flood stage.
- Points in yellowexpected to reachaction stage.
- Points in green expected to stay below action stage




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#### **Maximum Wind Gusts**

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- ✓ South-Southwest winds becoming westerly.
   Sustained winds 15 – 25 mph with gusts up to 50mph
- ✓ Strong winds expected from 5PM Thurs Oct 31 to 8PM Fri Nov 1, 2019.
- Strong winds may result in downed tree limbs and a few power outages.

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### **Event Summary**

Confidence is moderate for both heavy rain and strong winds to result in impacts.

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- Rivers are expected to rise with some river points expected to reach flood stage.
- High rainfall rates may result in poor drainage flooding in urban/low lying areas, especially where fallen leaves have clogged storm drains.
- Strong winds with peak wind gusts up to 50mph may result in downed tree limbs or a few power outages.
- ✓ Period of greatest impact:
  - ✓ Flood Watch in effect from 5PM Thurs Oct 31 to 12PM Fri Nov 1, 2019
  - Wind Advisory in effect from 5PM Thurs Oct 31 to 8PM Fri Nov 1, 2019.
    Strongest wind gusts expected 2AM to 2PM Friday Nov 1, 2019.
