

Slight Risk of Severe T-Storms expanded into much of eastern NY for this evening.

Severe T-storm Winds



Downed trees and powerlines, and isolated structural damage associated with the strongest storms.

All of eastern New York and western **New England** 

**Mainly 8 PM Today** through 3 AM Friday

**Flooding** 



Heavy rain will result in rises on creeks and streams with some rivers expected to reach flood stage. High rainfall rates may result in poor drainage flooding in urban and low lying areas.

Along and north of Interstate 90 in eastern New York and southern **Vermont** 

5 PM Today through 1 PM Friday

Strong Winds



South-Southwest winds becoming westerly. Sustained between 15 to 25 mph with gusts up to 50 mph.

All of eastern New York and western **New England** 


5 PM Today through 8 PM Friday

Strongest wind gusts expected between 2 AM and 2 PM Friday

















#### **Storm Total Rainfall:**

- Through 8 AM Friday
- 1-3 inches expected with isolated higher amounts possible in the Adirondacks, Catskills & southern Greens.









### **River Points Expected to Reach Flood Stage**

- Points in red expected to reach moderate flood stage.
- Points in orange expected to reach minor flood stage.
- Points in yellow expected to reach action stage.
- Points in green expected to stay below action stage














#### **Maximum Wind Gusts**

- South-Southwest winds becoming westerly. Sustained winds 15 – 25 mph with gusts up to 55 mph.
- Strong winds expected from 5 PM today to 8 PM Friday.
- Strong winds may result in downed tree limbs and a few power outages.











## **Event Summary**

- Confidence is **moderate** for both heavy rain and strong winds to result in impacts, along with embedded severe thunderstorms with damaging wind gusts.
- ✓ A line of strong to severe thunderstorms is possible late this evening with damaging. winds being the primary threat.
- Rivers are expected to rise with some river points expected to reach flood stage.
- High rainfall rates may result in poor drainage flooding in urban/low lying areas, especially where fallen leaves have clogged storm drains.
- Strong winds with peak wind gusts up to 55 mph may result in downed tree limbs or a few power outages.
- Period of greatest impact:
  - ✓ Flood Watch in effect from 5 PM Today through 1 PM Friday.
  - ✓ Wind Advisory in effect from 5 PM Today through 8 PM Friday.
  - Strongest wind gusts expected between 2 AM to 2 PM Friday.












