

High Wind Warning Wind Advisory

What Has Changed?

- High Wind Warning issued for 5 am through 6 pm Friday for gusts up to 65 mph
- Flood Watch is now in effect until 8 pm Friday



Impacts:

- Downed branches, trees and power lines
- Isolated structural damage
- **Power Outages**
- Lightning Strikes

Timing:

8 pm today through 3 am tonight

THUNDERSTORMS (no label)

No severe* thunderstorms expected

Lightning/flooding threats exist with all thunderstorms

- MARGINAL (MRGL)

Isolated severe thunderstorms possible

Limited in duration and/or coverage and/or intensity

2 - SLIGHT (SLGT)

Scattered severe storms possible

Short-lived and/or not widespread. isolated intense storms possible

3 - ENHANCED (ENH)

Numerous severe storms possible

More persistent and/or widespread, a few intense

4 - MODERATE (MDT)

Widespread severe storms likely

Long-lived, widespread and intense

5 - HIGH (HIGH)

Widespread severe storms expected

Long-lived, very widespread and particularly intense








Rain Forecast

Valid: This Afternoon Through Friday



Storm Total Rainfall:

- Through Friday with bulk of the rainfall occurring tonight
- Widespread 1 to 2 inches
- Localized up to 3 inches across the Adirondacks





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Flood Watch through 8 pm Friday



Flood Watches Warnings and Advisories

Flood Watch

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Sharp rises on many streams and rivers will occur across the Mohawk River Basin, northern Hudson River Basin, headwaters from the Adirondacks, Walloomsac and Hoosic River Basins with minor to moderate flooding expected












River Points Expected to Reach Flood Stage



- Points in **RED** expected to reach moderate flood stage
- Points in **ORANGE** expected to reach minor flood stage
- Points in YELLOW expected to reach action stage
- Points in GREEN expected to stay below action stage











Impacts:

- Downed branches, trees and power lines
- Isolated structural damage
- Power outages especially Friday when the strongest winds are expected










Maximum Wind Gusts



Maximum Wind Gusts

- Southerly winds becoming westerly overnight
- Sustained winds 15 to 25 mph with gusts up to 50 mph through the overnight
- Sustained winds 15 to 30 mph with gusts up to 50 to 65 mph Friday
- Strongest winds expected 8 am through 4 pm Friday

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Event Summary

- Confidence is moderate for heavy rain and high for strong/damaging winds to result in impacts, along with embedded severe thunderstorms with damaging wind gusts
- A line of strong to severe thunderstorms is possible this evening into the overnight hours with damaging winds the primary threat
- Sharp rises on many streams and rivers will occur across the Mohawk River Basin, northern Hudson River Basin, headwaters from the Adirondacks, Walloomsac and Hoosic River Basins with minor to moderate flooding expected
- Poor drainage flooding in urban and low lying areas, especially where fallen leaves have clogged storm drains
- Wind gusts of 50 to 65 mph resulting in downed branches, trees and power lines resulting power outages and isolated structural damage
- Period of greatest impact:
 - Flood Watch: through 8 pm Friday
 - Wind Advisory: through 8 pm Friday
 - High Wind Warning: 5 am to 6 pm Friday (strongest winds 8 am to 4 pm Friday)
