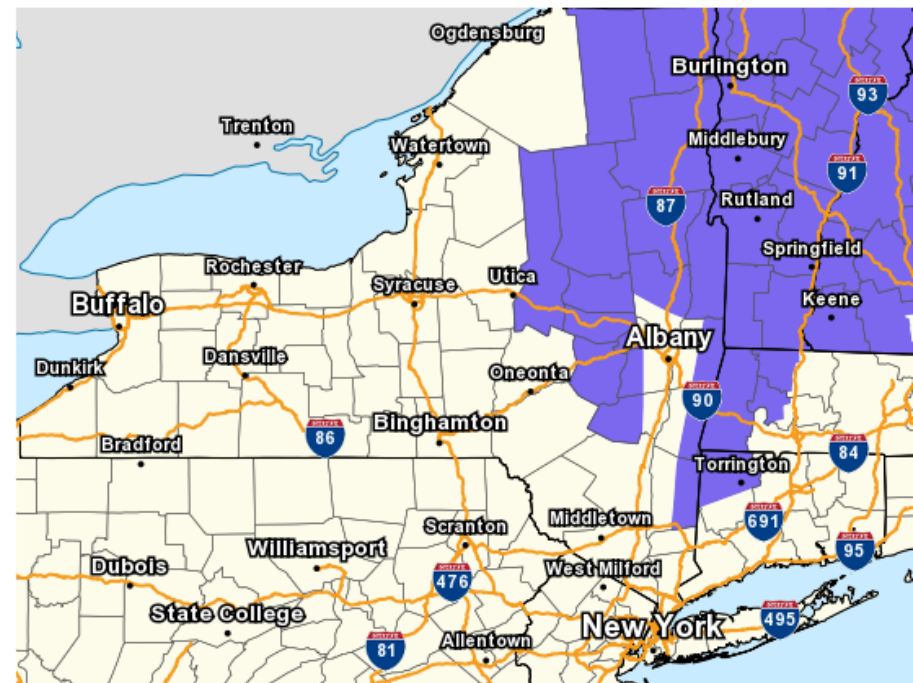
What Has Changed?

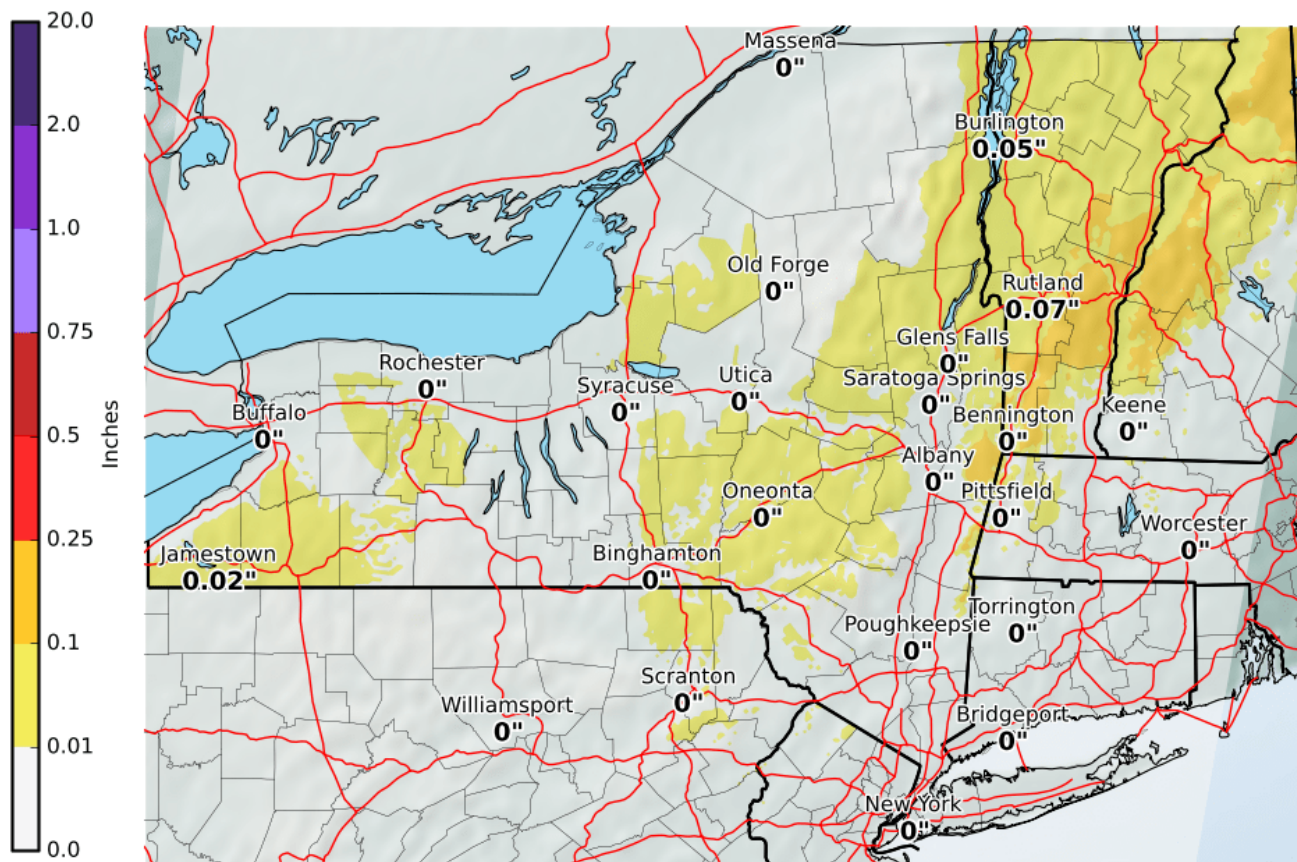

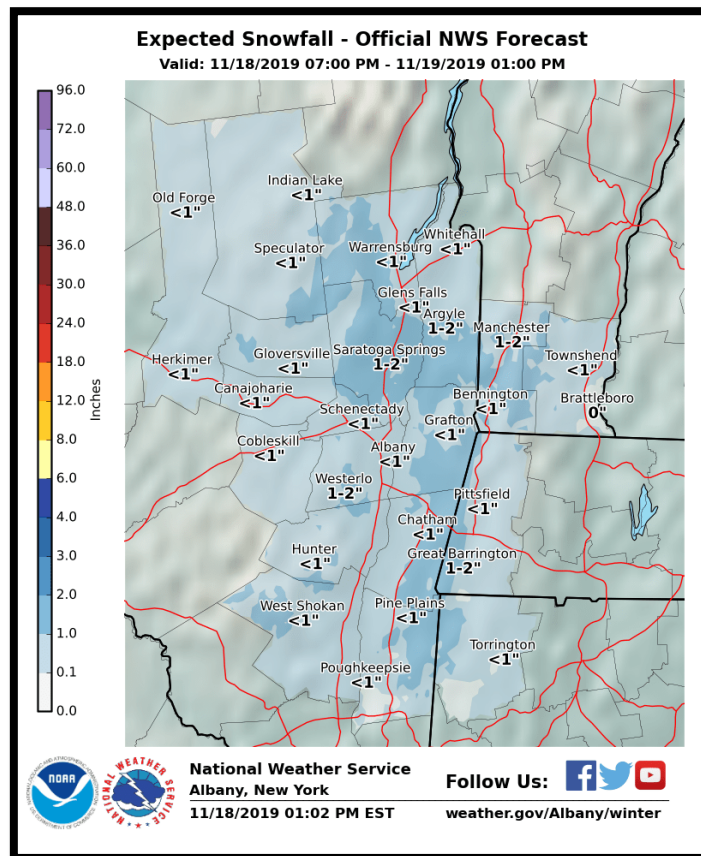
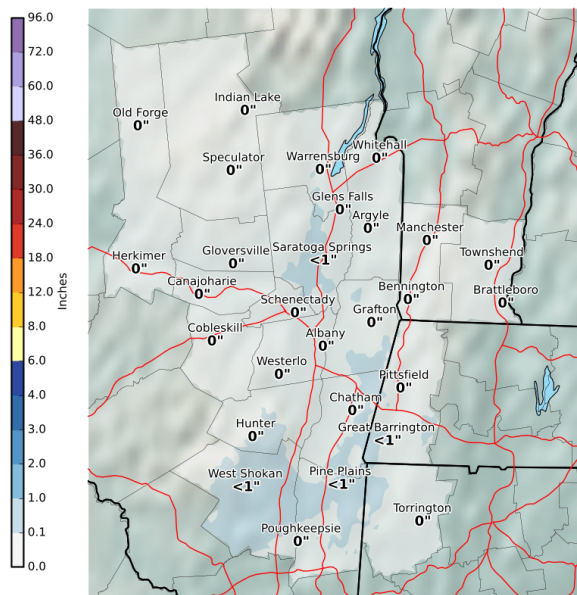

Expected Snowfall

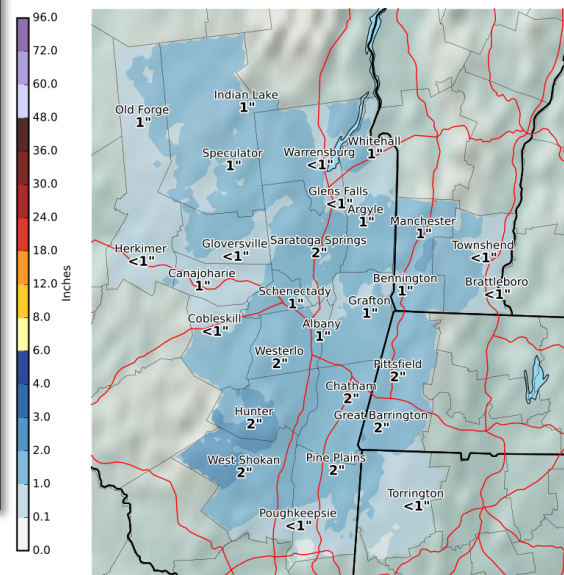
Low End Amount

Valid: 11/18/2019 07:00 PM - 11/19/2019 01:00 PM



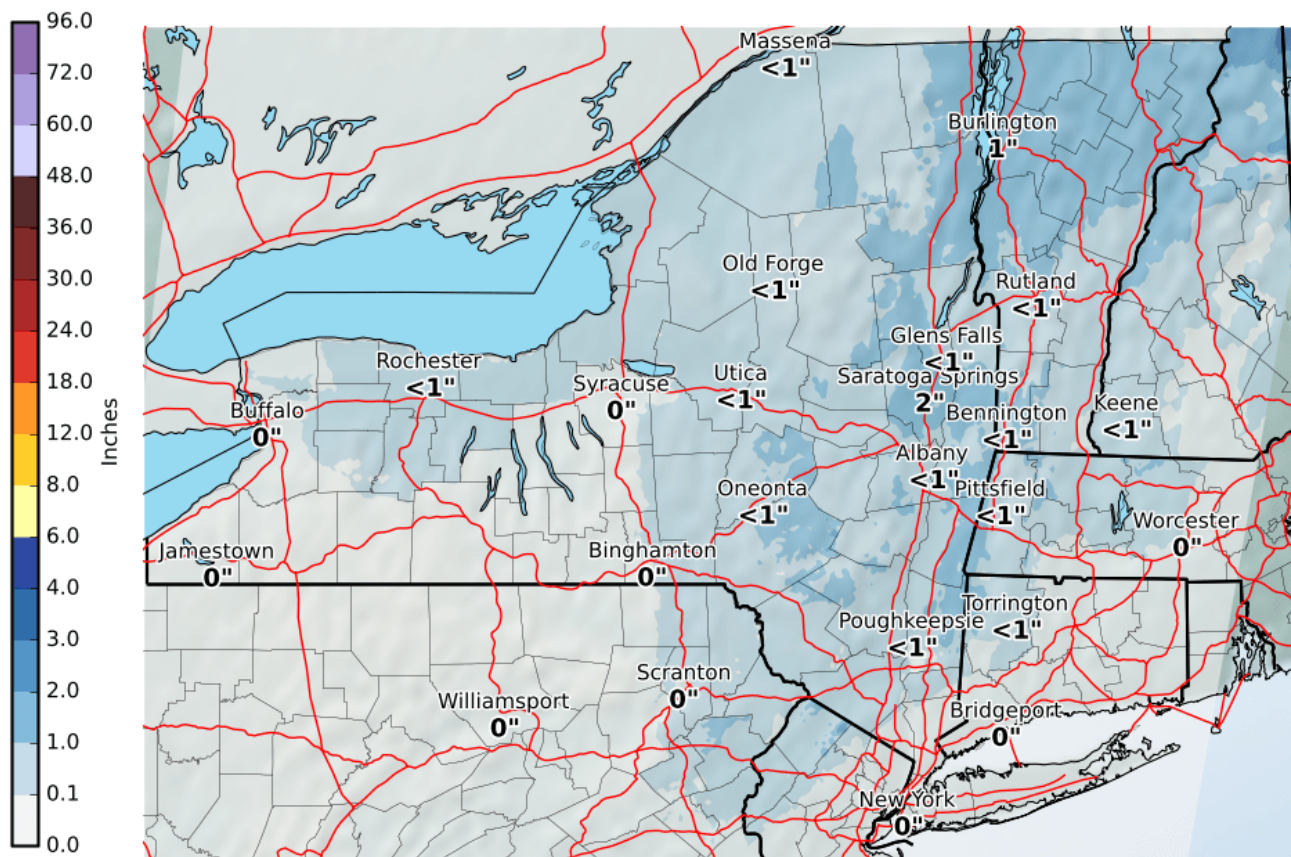
High End Amount

Event Summary

Freezing rain this evening transitioning to a wintry mix overnight ending as snow Tuesday morning....

- ✓ Confidence is **MODERATE** that this event will occur and **MODERATE** on expected impacts
- ✓ Period of greatest impact: Tonight into Tuesday morning



Freezing rain this evening into the overnight for western New England and east central New York excluding the Hudson Valley from the Poughkeepsie area up into the Capital District and Ulster County. Up to a tenth of an inch of ice is possible especially across the higher terrain resulting in slippery travel on untreated roadways.

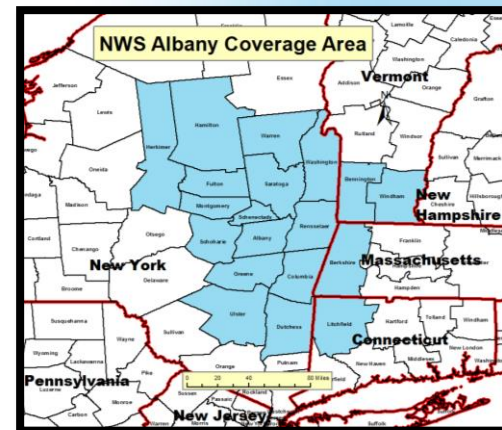


Precipitation will become steadier and heavier tonight. A wintry mix is expected to develop late tonight ending as snow especially over the higher elevations Tuesday morning. Snow covered roads will lead to hazardous travel late tonight into Tuesday morning impacting the morning commute.
