




## Wintry Mix Tonight through Sunday Afternoon

### **Decision Support Briefing #1** As of: 415 PM **November 23, 2019**

#### What Has Changed?

This is the first issuance, as Winter Weather Advisories have been issued for portions of eastern New York and western New England











# **Main Points**

Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Snow/Sleet	Possible slippery conditions and snow covered roads. Reduced visibilities from the snow and sleet.	Eastern Catskills, Heldbergs, Schoharie Valley, northern and central Taconics of NY, and western New England excluding southern Litchfield County	Tonight through Sunday Afternoon
Freezing Rain	Ice covered roads and slippery travel.	Eastern Catskills, Schoharie Valley, Helderbergs, northern and central Taconics of NY, and western New England excluding southern Litchfield County	Early Sunday morning through the afternoon













# **Probabilistic Snowfall Forecast thru Sunday Afternoon**

### **Expected Snowfall**


#### **Low End Amount**

#### **High End Amount**


















## Impacts and Timing:

Snow covered roads and reduced visibilities with hazardous travel late tonight through Sunday afternoon














### Ice Accumulations through Sunday Afternoon

# **Event Summary**

Snow or a wintry mix transitioning back to snow...

- Confidence is MODERATE that this event will occur and MODERATE on expected impacts
- Period of greatest impact: Late tonight into Sunday afternoon



Snow and sleet changing to a mix of freezing rain and plain rain late Sunday morning, then changing back to snow in the afternoon. 1 to 4 inches of snow and sleet accumulation across the eastern Catskills, Schoharie Valley, central and northern Taconics of eastern New York, and western New England excluding southern Litchfield County.



A light glaze to a tenth of an inch of ice is possible in the same locations which will make untreated surfaces slippery and difficult to travel or walk on.
