#### What Has Changed?

✓ A Winter Storm Watch has been issued for all of eastern NY and western New England.











## **Main Points**

Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Snow	Snow covered roads, reduced visibility and hazardous travel Sunday through Monday	Eastern New York and western New England	Light to moderate snow spreads across eastern NY Sunday morning and into western New England Sunday afternoon. Snow Sunday night becomes periods of moderate to heavy snow on Monday
Sleet/Ice	Possible slippery road conditions Sunday night into Monday morning, light accumulations of sleet and trace accumulations of ice	Dutchess and Ulster Counties in east central NY and northwestern Connecticut	Sunday night into Monday Morning













## **Probabilistic Snowfall Forecast Sunday Morning into early Monday Evening**

#### **Low End Amount**




**Expected Snowfall**

#### **High End Amount**
















## Impacts and Timing:

Snow covered roads and reduced visibilities with hazardous travel Sunday into Monday evening.

**Snowfall forecasts** will be updated periodically as new information becomes available









## **Event Summary**

Moderate to Heavy Snow is potentially expected Sunday through Monday with a period of mix Sunday night south of Albany, as a Winter Storm Watch is in effect 7 am Sunday to 7 pm Monday....

- Confidence is MODERATE that this event will occur and MODERATE on expected impacts
- Period of greatest impact: Sunday through Monday
- Hazardous Travel Expected Sunday through Monday with both commutes impacted



Light to moderate snow Sunday and Sunday night. Snow becomes moderate to heavy Monday, ending Monday night. 9 or more inches is possible across all of eastern NY and western New England



Light accumulations of sleet possibly mixes with the snow Sunday night in the mid Hudson Valley and northwestern Connecticut. There is also a threat for ice accumulations up to a tenth of an inch in Dutchess, Ulster, and Litchfield Counties.


