

Updated storm totals snowfall









Snow/Sleet **	Snow covered roads, very low visibility and dangerous travel	Eastern New York and western New England	Until 7 am Tuesday













Probabilistic Snowfall Through Tonight

Graphics show additional snowfall starting 7 pm this evening


Expected Additional Snowfall



Snow covered roads and reduced visibilities leading to hazardous travel through tonight.


















Event Summary

Long-duration winter storm continue tonight

Confidence **MODERATE to HIGH** on expected impacts



Snow continues until 7 am Tuesday morning, moderate to heavy at times with rates of around an inch an hour possible early tonight. Reduced visibilities in the moderate to heavy snow bands to a half a miles or less.
