Main Points

Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Dense Fog	Hazardous driving conditions due to poor visibility	Much of eastern New York and all of western New England	Through 1 AM Tuesday
Rain and Snowmelt, River Rises	Runoff from rain and snow melt may cause flooding especially in blocked drainage areas. Also rises on rivers and creeks will occur with a few points approaching or possibly exceeding flood stage.	Eastern New York and western New England	Through Tuesday
Light Snow	Potentially Hazardous Travel due to a light snowfall	South and east of the Capital District	Tuesday night into Wednesday morning












Rainfall Forecast Valid: Through Tuesday Evening



- Runoff from rainfall and snowmelt through Tuesday will cause rises on rivers and creeks
- ✓ A few points may approach or possibly exceed minor flood stage. This is most likely on the Hoosic River at Eagle Bridge NY and on the Walloomsac at Bennington VT
- ✓ Also flooding of low lying and poor drainage areas may occur especially where drainages are blocked by snow

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



Event Summary

- **Dense Fog Advisory issued through 1 AM Tuesday**
 - Dense fog will cause poor visibility, resulting in hazardous travel this evening through around 1 AM Tuesday
- Rain and Snowmelt through Tuesday with flooding possible
 - A few river points may approach or possibly exceed minor flood stage. This is most likely on the Hoosic River at Eagle Bridge NY and on the Walloomsac at Bennington VT
 - Flooding of low lying and poor drainage areas is likely especially where drains are blocked by snow
- ✓ Light snowfall south & east Capital District Tuesday night into **Wednesday morning**
 - A period of light snow is expected Tuesday night into Wednesday
 - This could cause some slippery travel


