





What Has Changed?

Wind Advisory issued for portions of eastern New York and western New England tonight through Sunday















Main Points

Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Snow	3 to 7 inches of snow resulting in slippery travel and reduced visibilities	Northern Herkimer and Hamilton Counties	10 pm this evening to 1 pm Sunday
Wind	Gusts to 50 mph could blow down unsecured objects. Tree limbs could be blown down, resulting in scattered power outages.	The Green Mountains in southern Vermont, western Massachusetts, and the Mohawk and Schoharie Valleys, Capital District, and northern and central Taconics, eastern Catskills, and Fulton and Hamilton Counties in eastern New York	1 am to 7 pm Sunday
















Most likely time of winter precipitation onset









Probabilistic Snowfall Forecast

High End Amount





FORECAST ADDITIONAL SNOWFALL BEGINNING AT 7 PM TONIGHT







Timing:

✓ West-northwesterly winds increase late this evening and become strong tonight into Sunday







Event Summary

Accumulating snow over the western Adirondacks and strong winds over portions of eastern New York and western New England....

- Confidence is **HIGH** that this event will occur and **MODERATE** on expected impacts
- Period of greatest impact: Tonight through Sunday



Rain will change to snow between 7–10 pm over the western Adirondacks and accumulate 3–7 inches through 1 pm Sunday west of Speculator and Indian Lake. The snow will result in slippery travel conditions and reduced visibility.



Wind will increase this evening with westerly gusts up to 50 mph possible 1 am to 7 pm Sunday in areas where the Wind Advisory is in effect. The gusts may blow around unsecured items and down tree limbs, resulting in scattered power outages.


