




Snow Squalls Today Frigid Temperatures Tonight-Thursday

What Has Changed?

Wind Chill Advisories have been issued for the southern Adirondacks, west/central Mohawk Valley, Schoharie Valley, Helderbergs, southeastern Catskills, north/central Taconics, and Berkshires.













Main Points

Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Snow Squalls	Rapid changes to visibility including brief whiteout conditions in any snow squall. Very Dangerous travel conditions.	All areas of eastern NY and western New England	Mainly between 10am and 5pm
Cold Temperatures & Wind Chill	Very cold temperatures combined with strong winds could lead to dangerous wind chills between -15°F and -25°F	Southern Adirondacks, Mohawk Valley, Schoharie Valley, Helderbergs, eastern Catskills, Taconics,	Tonight into early Thursday













Peak Wind Forecast

















Wind Chill Advisory Tonight into Thursday morning



















Thursday Temperature Forecast













Event Summary

- Confidence is **HIGH** that snow squalls will occur today and **MODERATE** on expected impacts.
- Period of greatest impact for Snow Squalls: Between 10AM and 5PM Today
- Dangerous Travel Conditions Expected During Any Snow Squalls. This may include the Evening Commute



Snow Squalls today will lead to rapidly changing visibility including brief, whiteout conditions.



Very cold temperatures combined with strong winds tonight into early Thursday will lead to dangerous wind chill values between -15°F and -25°F across the southern Adirondacks, west/central Mohawk Valley, Schoharie Valley, Helderbergs, southeastern Catskills, north/central Taconics, and Berkshires.
