What Has Changed?

- ✓ Gale Warnings for southeastern waters



Main Points

Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Heavy Snow 	Heavy snow. Isolated power outages possible.	Heaviest snow mostly likely across interior central/northeast MA. Limited power outage threat southeast MA and RI.	Heaviest snow from 10 PM Sunday to 5 AM Monday

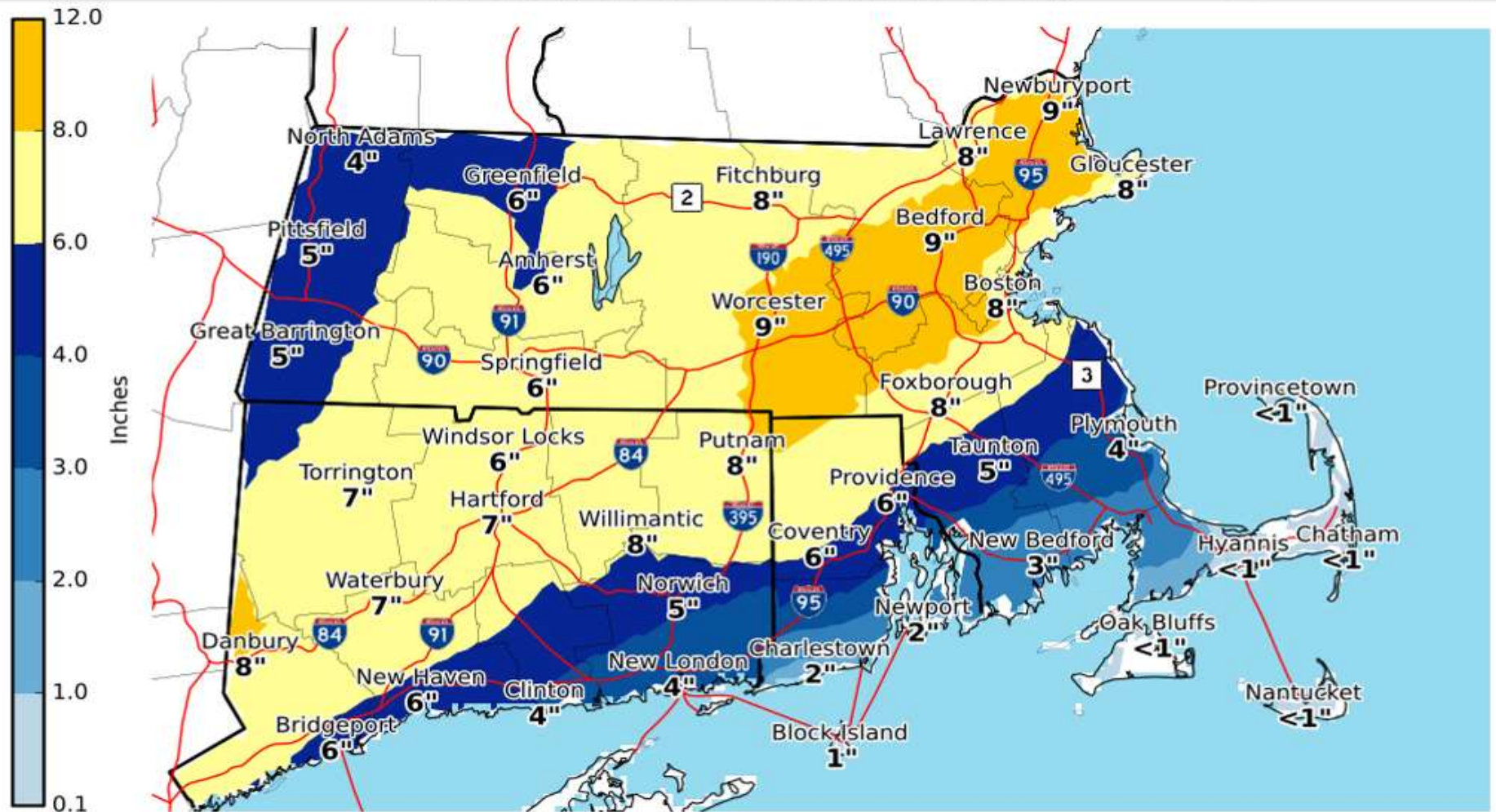

Threat Event Summary

- ✓ **Confidence/Uncertainty**: High confidence in a plowable snowfall. The greatest uncertainty is where the band of highest snow totals will set up, as well as how far north into southeast MA/RI the rain/snow line will reach.

- ✓ **What:**



Snow with accumulations of 6 to locally 10 inches across much of the region. Mainly rain across Cape Cod and the islands.

- ✓ **Where:** Snow across all of southern New England. Snow changing rapidly to rain on Cape Cod and the islands. Heaviest snow most likely over interior northeast MA.

- ✓ **When:** Beginning between 6-8 PM, ending Monday morning (early west, late east). Heaviest snow generally 10 PM Sun to 5 AM Mon
