




Wet Snow With Highest Amounts Across Rhode Island And Southeast MA

What Has Changed?

- ✓ No significant changes.
- ✓ Winter Storm Warnings issued for Plymouth and Bristol Counties in MA.
- ✓ Winter Weather Advisories cover all of RI, northern CT, southwest, central and northeast MA.











Main Points

Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Heavy Wet Snow	Wet snow, with occasional snowfall rates of 1 in/hr possible. Isolated to scattered power outages possible focused across SE MA and RI.	Heaviest snow across southeast Massachusetts and perhaps into portions of RI. Greatest power outage threat southeast MA and RI.	Heaviest snow from 7 AM to 1 PM today. Lighter snowfall continues during the afternoon.
Gusty Winds	Could exacerbate risk for power outages	Southeast MA and RI.	Today.










Expected Snowfall Late Tonight And Saturday

Threat Event Summary

✓ <u>Confidence</u>: High confidence in a plowable snowfall. Uncertainty is if the higher end snowfall amounts are realized, which would increase the power outage threat. Highest risk for this is across southeast MA and Rhode Island.

✓ What:



Wet Snow with accumulations of 2 to 6 inches across most of the region. Higher amounts of 4 to 8 inches expected across southeast MA. A period of rain and sleet may result in lower accumulations across the Cape and Islands.

✓ Where: All of southern New England with the heaviest snow expected

across southeast MA into Rhode Island.

✓ When: Beginning 6 AM, continuing into this afternoon.

Heaviest snow expected from 7 am until 1 PM.
