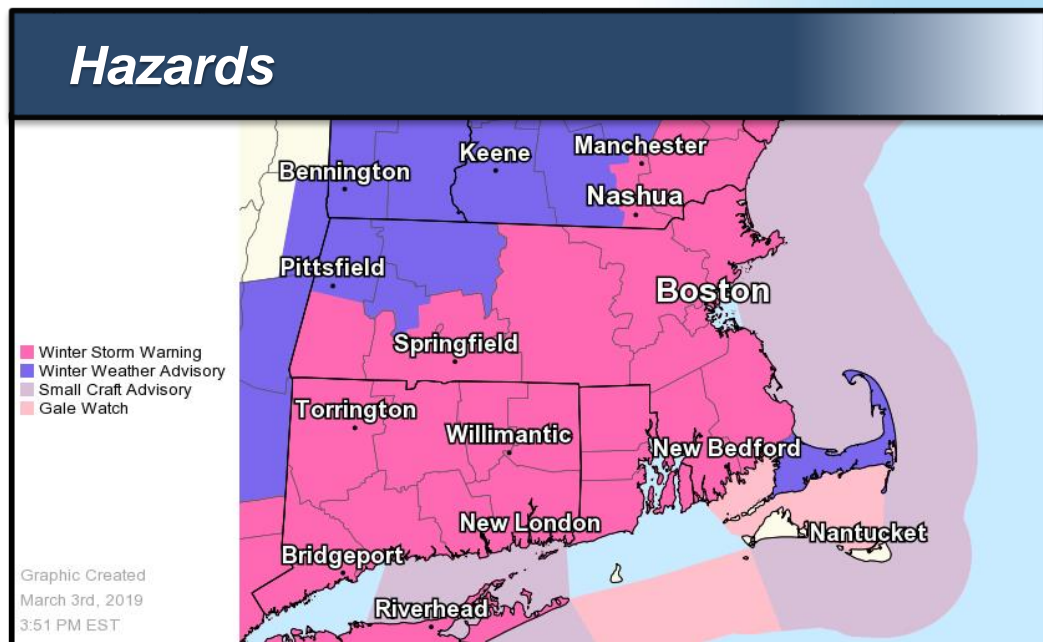


# Snow Event Tonight through Monday Morning

## What Has Changed?

- ✓ Snowfall increased slightly, now expecting a swath of closer to 8-10 from Northern CT – Northern RI – Eastern MA.
- ✓ Winter Storm Warning now in Southern Berkshire County.
- ✓ Gale Warning in effect for Southeast Waters for Monday.



# Main Points

Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
<b>Heavy Snow</b> 	Heavy snow. Scattered power outages possible.	Heaviest snow mostly likely across RI and central/eastern MA.  Limited power outage threat southeast MA and RI.	Heaviest snow from 10 PM Sunday to 6 AM Monday.  Peak 1-2inch/hour rates 1AM – 6AM

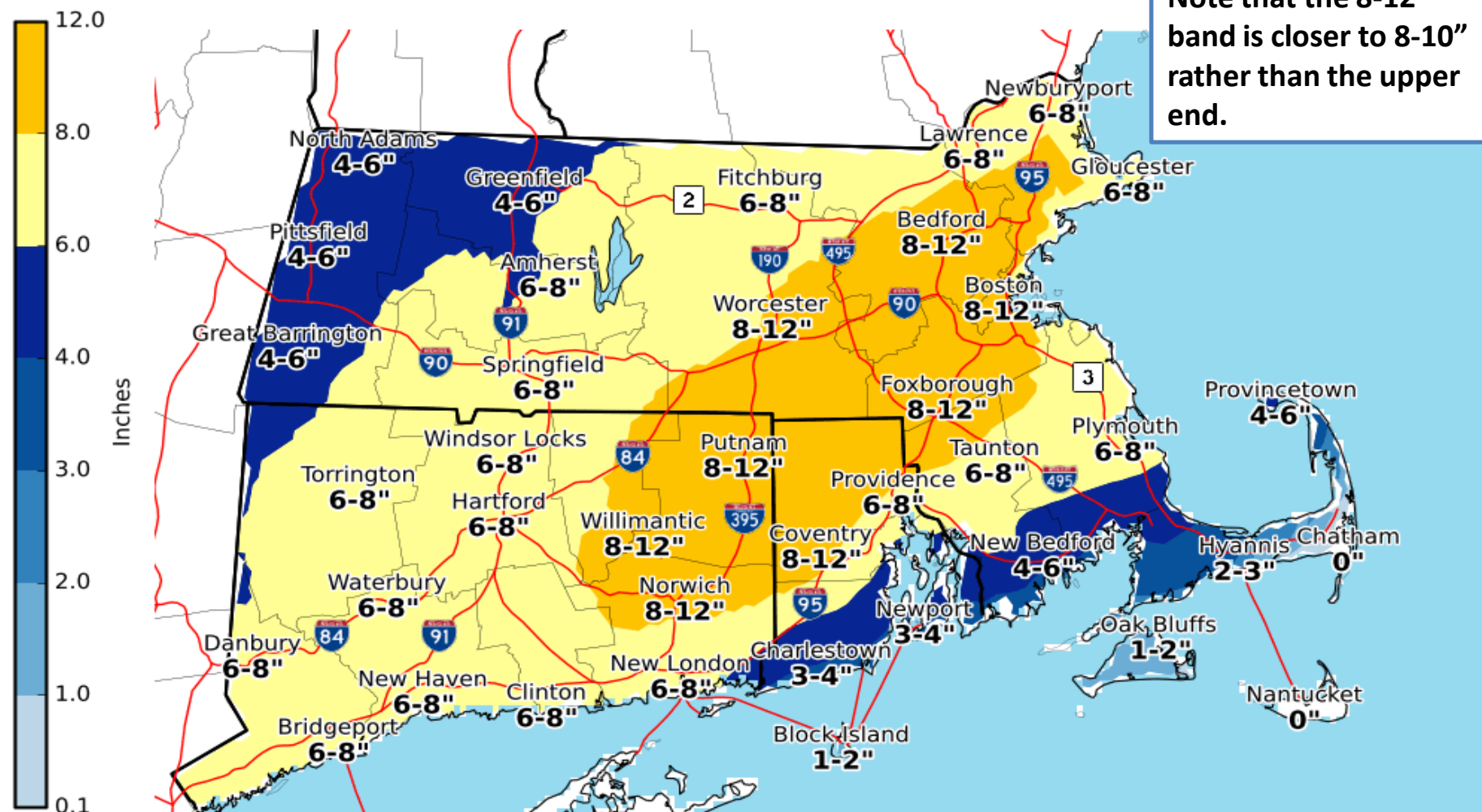


## Forecast Storm Total Snowfall

### Expected Snowfall - Official NWS Forecast

Valid: This Evening - Monday Morning

Note that the 8-12" band is closer to 8-10" rather than the upper end.

# Threat Event Summary

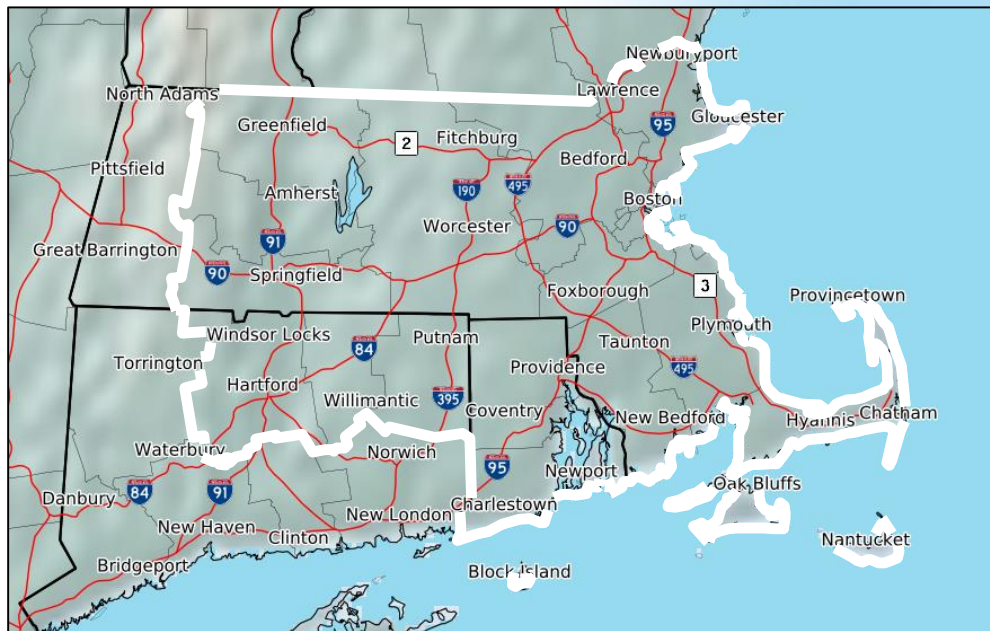
- ✓ **Confidence/Uncertainty:** High confidence in a plowable snowfall. The greatest uncertainty is where the band of highest snow totals will set up as it could be anywhere within the 8-12" snowfall bin. The rain/snow line will move further inland than the Cape Cod Canal.
  
- ✓ **What:**  
 Snow with accumulations of 6 to 10 inches across much of the region. Snow changes to rain across Cape Cod and the islands.
  
- ✓ **Where:** Snow across all of southern New England. Snow changing to rain on Cape Cod and the islands. Heaviest snow most likely over interior RI and central/eastern MA.
  
- ✓ **When:** Beginning between 6-8 PM west and 8-10 PM east.  
Ending Monday morning 4-6 AM west and south, 6-8 AM northeast  
Heaviest snow generally 10 PM Sun to 6 AM Mon
