



What Has Changed?

- ✓ Severe Thunderstorm Watch goes till 10 pm
- ✓ Flash Flood Watch goes till 11 pm

Main Points

Flooding Excessive rainfall risk with short-duration 2 to 3 inch amounts		Risk of localized flash flooding of small streams and low water crossings; minor flooding of poor drainage, ubran areas	All areas of Southern New England could be affected	Through Thursday
Heat & Humidity Heat indices around 95°F to 105°F		Sunstroke, muscle cramps and/or heat exhaustion likely with prolonged exposure	All of Southern New England except Cape Cod & the Islands	Friday through Sunday Especially Saturday



Threat Information



HAIL

Isolated Hail Up To Quarter Size Possible



WIND

Scattered Gusts
Up To 70 MPH Possible



LIGHTNING

Frequent Lightning Possible



SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WATCH goes till 10p. Main concerns are locally strong to damaging winds contributing to isolated tree and / or power line damage.

Valid until 11 PM EDT this evening July 17th, 2019

Threat Information



MODERATE TO HEAVY RAINFALL

- Torrential downpours
- · Around 2" / hr rainfall rates
- Storm total rainfall as high as around 3"



FLOODING

 Urban and poor-drainage flooding is possible.



FLASH FLOOD WATCH till 11p. Storms will contain heavy downpours w/ rainfall rates of 1-4"/hr. Total rainfall as high as @ 3" is possible. Potential for urban, poor-drainage flooding.












Severe Weather Outlook – Today, Wednesday, July 17th, 2019

Impacts

- Locally strong to damaging winds which may result in isolated tree and/or power line damage
- ✓ Heavy downpours with potential 1-2"
 per hour rainfall rates which may
 contribute to localized urban, poordrainage flooding. Storm total rainfall
 amounts up as high as around 3"

Timing

✓ Scattered showers and thunderstorms, some of which will be strong to severe will sweep across the area through the afternoon into evening hours, exiting off S-coastal New England around 10 pm











Probability of damaging thunderstorm winds or wind gusts of 50 knots or higher within 25 miles of a point.









Excessive Rainfall Outlooks – Today, Wednesday, July 17th, 2019



Heavy downpours with potential 1-4" per hour rainfall rates which may contribute to localized urban, poor-drainage flooding. Storm total rainfall amounts up as high as around 3"












Forecast Maximum Heat Index ... Friday, July 19th, 2019

Valid: Friday, July 19th, 2019








Forecast Maximum Heat Index ... Saturday, July 20th, 2019

Valid: Saturday, July 20th, 2019








Forecast Maximum Heat Index ... Sunday, July 21st, 2019

Threat Event Summary

- ✓ <u>Confidence</u>: Scattered shower and thunderstorm activity ongoing embedded in which there is the threat for strong to damaging winds, isolated tree and/or power line damage, as well as heavy downpours with potential localized urban, poor-drainage flooding. High confidence concerning the heat and humidity for Friday through Sunday.
- ✓ What / Where / When:



Locally strong to damaging winds are possible with forecast thunderstorm activity through roughly around 10 pm. Across all of Southern New England there is the threat for isolated tree and / or power line damage.



Heavy downpours are anticipated with rainfall rates of 1 to 4 inches per hour. Storm total rainfall amounts as high as around 3 inches. Beginning around noon today and continuing into Thursday. Any heavy rainfall brings the risk for localized urban, poor-drainage flooding over all of Southern New England.



Heat and humidity is forecast Friday through Sunday over all of Southern New England except Cape Cod & the Islands with heat indices of around 95°F to 105°F. The warmest conditions anticipated Saturday, throughout there is the risk of heat-related illnesses such as sunstroke, muscle cramps and/or heat exhaustion with prolonged exposure.
