✓ Prime threat is damaging straight line wind gusts across interior southern New England.









Severe Weather Outlook – Day 1

Impacts

- ✓ Strong Wind Gusts
- ✓ Heavy T-storm Downpours

✓ 2 to 10 PM

Severe Weather Outlook – Definitions

THUNDERSTORMS (no label)

No severe* thunderstorms expected

Lightning/flooding threats exist with all thunderstorms

1 - MARGINAL (MRGL)

Isolated severe thunderstorms possible

Limited in duration and/or coverage and/or intensity

2 - SLIGHT (SLGT)

Scattered severe storms possible

Short-lived and/or not widespread, isolated intense storms possible

3 - ENHANCED (ENH)

Numerous severe storms possible

More persistent and/or widespread, a few intense

4 - MODERATE (MDT)

Widespread severe storms likely

Long-lived, widespread and intense

5 - HIGH (HIGH)

Widespread severe storms expected

Long-lived, very widespread and particularly intense



- Winds to 40 mph
- Small hail

- Winds 40-60 mph
- Hail up to 1"
- Low tornado risk



- One or two tornadoes
- Reports of strong winds/wind damage
- Hail ~1", isolated 2"



- A few tornadoes
- · Several reports of wind damage
- Damaging hail, 1 2"



- Strong tornadoes
- · Widespread wind damage
- · Destructive hail. 2" +



- · Tornado outbreak
- Derecho

* NWS defines a severe thunderstorm as measured wind gusts to at least 58 mph, and/or hail to at least one inch in diameter, and/or a tornado. All thunderstorm categories imply lightning and the potential for flooding. Categories are also tied to the probability of a severe weather event within 25 miles of your location.







Severe Weather Threat Event Summary

- **Confidence**: Moderate. Main uncertainty is timing of the afternoon storms.
- What:



Damaging straight line wind gusts of 50-65 mph possible.



Street flooding possible, especially in urban locations.



Isolated 1" diameter hail possible.



Low risk of an isolated tornado across western/central MA and northern CT.



Dangerous cloud-to-ground lightning with strongest storms

All of Southern New England, but greatest focus NW of Boston-Providence corridor.

When: 2 to 10 pm.
