
Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Wind	There is a risk for isolated to scattered minor wind damage.	Cape and islands	Friday Night into Saturday
Storm Surge/ Inundation	There is the potential for minor inundation in spots.	The usually vulnerable south-facing, ocean-exposed portions of the coast	Friday Night into Saturday
Flooding Rain	There is the potential for significant amounts of rainfall that could lead to some flooding	Cape and islands	Friday Night into Saturday
Tornado	There is a minimal risk for tornadoes	Cape and islands	Friday Night into Saturday
Marine	There is the potential for very dangerous conditions.	Mainly across the outermost coastal waters of MA, especially south and east of Nantucket	Friday Night into Saturday

- More significant wind impacts on the coastal waters


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
Threat Levels

threat.



Hurricane Dorian



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
- Increased risk for tropical storm force winds across Nantucket, and nearly steady threat across the Cape, Vineyard and Block Island.
- Tropical Storm conditions could begin as early as Friday evening.
- Offshore track most likely at this time.

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Earliest Reasonable Time of Arrival

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- The earliest reasonable time of arrival of Tropical Storm Force Winds for the Cape and islands is Friday evening.
- However, the most likely time this area could see Tropical Storm Force Winds will be during Friday night into Saturday.

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
