



What has changed

- ✓ Winter Storm Watches issued for portions of MA and CT
- ✓ Less risk of heavy snow for RI

Interior portions of Southern New England – mainly northern CT, northern RI, interior southeast MA
















Forecast Storm Total Snowfall

Valid: Noon Sunday through 7 pm Monday













Forecast Storm Total Ice

Threat Event Summary

- ✓ Confidence: High for >6 inches of snow in some areas by Monday morning.
- ✓ What/When/Where:



1-2"/hr snowfall rates Sunday night with >6 by the Mon. AM commute. Greatest risk west of I-95. Light to moderate snow with additional accumulations Monday into Tuesday morning.



Wind gusts 30-40 mph Sun. night into Tue. along coast



A period of light freezing rain (<0.2") possible late Sunday night, after the initial snow, in interior sections – especially northern CT, northern RI, interior eastern MA











Concerns:

Threat Event Summary

- ✓ East flow becoming northeast along coast, with water temps. of 48 degrees. This could lead to situation where eastern parts of Boston are primarily rain while the western parts of Boston and Metro-West are heavy snow.
- Exact location/timing of transition from snow to freezing rain/rain still uncertain.
 This could cut down snow amounts if occurs more rapidly than expected.
- Snowfall rates Monday into early Tuesday are uncertain. Steady, but more manageable snowfall accumulations expected. Storm totals by Tuesday morning could be in excess of one foot in areas that remained all snow.
- ✓ Storm surge up to 2 feet is expected. However with very low astronomical tides, any coastal flood issues are expected to be limited to splashover around the times of high tide.


