



Isolated severe thunderstorms possible

- MARGINAL

(MRGL)

Limited in duration and/or coverage and/or intensity

2 - SLIGHT (SLGT)

Scattered severe storms possible

Short-lived and/or not widespread, isolated intense storms possible

3 - ENHANCED (ENH)

Numerous severe storms possible

More persistent and/or widespread, a few intense

4 - MODERATE (MDT)

Widespread severe storms likely

Long-lived, widespread and intense

5 - HIGH (HIGH)

Widespread severe storms expected

Long-lived, very widespread and particularly intense



- Winds to 40 mph
- · Small hail

- Winds 40-60 mph
- Hail up to 1"
- · Low tornado risk



- One or two tornadoes
 A few tornadoes
- Reports of strong winds/wind damage Hail ~1", isolated 2"
- Several reports of wind damage
- Damaging hail, 1 2



- Strong tornadoes
- Widespread wind damage
- Destructive hail, 2"+



- Tornado outbreak

- * NWS defines a severe thunderstorm as measured wind gusts to at least 58 mph, and/or hail to at least one inch in diameter, and/or a tornado. All thunderstorm categories imply lightning and the potential for flooding. Categories are also tied to the probability of a severe weather event within 25 miles of your location.
