



OVERVIEW:

- Coastal storm likely to bring heavy snow, strong winds, and coastal flooding late Wednesday into Thursday.
- Track still somewhat uncertain - should have better idea Monday

TIMING	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Peak of storm Wednesday night into Thursday
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Heavy snow. Although mainly dry and powdery, potential for more than a foot of snow, impacting transportation. Blowing and drifting snow reducing visibility.▪ Minor to moderate coastal flooding and beach erosion along the eastern MA coast, especially Thu. afternoon.▪ Minor wind damage and isolated power outages, especially along RI and MA coasts.
NWS ALERTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ No headlines issued yet for this potential storm.
FORECAST CHALLENGES	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Track of the storm is key to where heaviest snow falls. Too early to pinpoint - all of the area is at risk.
ADDITIONAL INFORMATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ There is some potential for a sharp north-south gradient to exist, with lesser totals north of the Mass Pike, but too uncertain at this time.▪ 1"-2"/hour snowfall rates possible overnight Wed. night.
