# **Main Points**

Visibility possibly lowering to less than a quarter mile at times

All areas but greatest risk across CT into Western-Central MA where deepest snowpack exist






#### Forecast Maximum Sustained Winds

Valid: Thursday Night into Friday





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






#### Forecast Maximum Wind Gusts

## Potential Max Wind Gusts (MPH)





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






## Forecast Storm Total Precipitation






## Forecast Maximum Wave Heights and Wind Gusts (in kts)


#### Potential Maximum Wave Height

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# **Threat Event Summary**

- ✓ Confidence: moderate confidence on a high impact weather event
- ✓ What:



25-40 mph sustained winds with gusts up to 60 mph, resulting in a risk for localized power outages



1 to 2 inches of rainfall with locally higher amounts up to 2.5 inches is possible. Minor river flooding & localized street & highway flooding



Areas of dense fog possible with visibility reduced to a quarter mile or less at times. Potential travel impacts

- ✓ Where: All of Southern New England (MA, RI & CT)
- ✓ When: Christmas Eve night into Christmas morning


