What Has Changed?

- A Winter Storm Watch is in effect for much of the region for Monday and Tuesday
- Decreased snow totals in far southeast MA. Increased the snow totals in western MA/CT

Main Points

Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Heavy Snow	Significant snow accumulations of 8 or more inches possible resulting in hazardous travel.	A significant part of Southern New England may be impacted, but specific locations remain uncertain. Less likely on Cape Cod and the islands.	Monday into Tuesday.
Strong Winds	Power outages possible along with a few downed trees.	Eastern MA and RI.	Later Monday into Tuesday.
Coastal Flood	Widespread Minor with pockets of moderate coastal flooding and beach erosion.	Portions of the Eastern Massachusetts coastline including Nantucket.	Monday night into Tuesday.
Marine	High Seas and Strong Winds may result in dangerous conditions for Mariners.	MA and RI Coastal Waters	Monday afternoon into Wednesday











Summary of Potentially Greatest Impacts








Forecast Storm Total Snowfall








Forecast Storm Total Snowfall (Best Case)








Forecast Storm Total Snowfall (Worst Case)





Coastal Flooding – Surge / Inundation

NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE



Minor Coastal Flooding

- Widespread minor coastal flooding expected
- Pockets of moderate coastal flooding including structural damage possible
- Vulnerable shore roads with up to a foot of water inundation possible. May be flooding of a few vulnerable basements.
- Some beach erosion with heavy surf.

Timing

Spanning multiple tide cycles, from Monday night into Tuesday

		Storm Surge Threat	Potential Impacts from Storm Surge		
	Little to None	0 to 1 feet above ground	No immediate preparations needed. Little to no potential storm surge flooding impacts		
t	Elevated	1 to 3 feet above ground	To be safe, prepare for the potential of limited storm surge flooding impacts		
	Moderate	3 to 6 feet above ground	To be safe, earnestly prepare for the potential of significant storm surge flooding impacts		
	High	6 to 9 feet above ground	To be safe, aggressively prepare for the potential of significant storm surge flooding impacts		
	Extreme	> 9 feet above ground	To be safe, aggressively prepare for the potential of devastating to catastrophic storm surge flooding impacts

Threat Event Summary

Confidence: Moderate to high confidence on a winter storm, with greatest uncertainty in where the risk for heaviest snow accumulations occur. Storm intensity, timing, and the rain/snow line will continue to be honed in on.

What:



Odds of a significant snow across much of southern New England are increasing



Strong winds may result in power outages and a few downed trees across eastern MA & RI.



Coastal flooding and beach erosion will be possible along the eastern MA coastline during the high tides Monday night and Tuesday.

- ✓ Where: The potential for significant snow accumulations exist across the entire region, outside of Cape Cod and the Islands. The strong wind and coastal flood threat will be across eastern MA & RI.
- ✓ When: Later Monday Into Tuesday.




