What Has Changed?

- ✓ Advisory start time was moved up to the present time due to freezing drizzle ahead of the main event.
- ✓ Snow amounts were lessened.

Freezing Rain



Ice accretion of one tenth to one third of an inch will result in hazardous travel conditions.

Isolated areas of one-third to one-half inch above 1000 ft elevation could cause some tree limb damage and/or power disruptions.


Greatest risk of tree limb damage and/or power outages is across higher terrain in Worcester hills and east slopes of Berkshires.

Hazardous travel conditions across all interior locations along and west of I-95. Brief icing possible near the coast Freezing drizzle this evening in eastern MA and RI.

Freezing rain begins 9 pm to midnight south of Route 2 and 11 PM to 1 AM north of Route 2.

Precipitation tapers off by noon Tuesday

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








Forecast Storm Total Ice











Forecast Storm Total Snowfall









Temperatures:

NW MA/Higher terrain: Mid 20s Tonight → Mid 30s Tue

Hartford/Worcester/Boston: Lower 30s Tonight → near 40 Tue

Providence/Taunton: Lower 30s this evening → Mid 30s Overnight → Lower 50s Tuesday!

Southern RI /Cape Cod/Islands: Mid 30s this evening → Lower to mid 50s Tuesday!

Lows Tuesday night... 10-15 NW to mid/upper 20s far southeast MA/southern RI, but NOT a sudden flash freeze situation

Interior Winds:

Tonight: E-NE 5-10 mph gusting to 10-15 mph

Tuesday: NE becoming W at 5-10 mph

Tuesday night: NW 10-20 mph gusting to 20-25 mph Worcester Hills/Northeast CT Hills









Looking ahead to Thursday, into Friday morning:

Another winter storm is likely. Precipitation amounts may be higher.

Looks like snow (more than with the Tuesday storm) on the front end,

Changing to a wintry mix of sleet, freezing rain, and rain again.

Too early to pinpoint amounts.

Could impact the Thursday evening commute.

Stay tuned.









Threat Event Summary

- ✓ <u>Confidence</u>: High confidence in ice accretion across interior southern New England with highest risk over the higher terrain
- ✓ What:



One tenth to one third of an inch of ice accretion west of I-95. Potential for one-third to one-half inch in the Worcester Hills and east slopes of the Berkshires, where could have tree limb damage and/or power disruptions. A glaze to one tenth of an inch of ice across the rest of southern New England away from the immediate coast

✓ Where: All of Southern New England away from the immediate coast

✓ When: Tonight into Tuesday morning


