

# Higher Elevation Snow Monday



## OVERVIEW:

- Accumulating wet snow over higher elevations Monday afternoon.
- Main concern is travel impacts during the evening commute, especially over higher elevations.

<b>TIMING</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Snow develops noon to 2 pm Monday across western MA and northern CT and by 3 pm across interior northeast MA.</li><li>▪ Precipitation ends 6-9 pm Monday evening from west to east.</li></ul>	
<b>HAZARDS &amp; IMPACTS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ 2 to 3 inches of snow over higher elevations in northern CT and central and western MA. Low risk for up to 4 inches across the east slopes of the Berkshires, northern Worcester Hills and Litchfield Hills.</li><li>▪ Snow covered roads will result in hazardous travel conditions.</li><li>▪ The evening commute will be impacted.</li></ul>	
<b>FORECAST CHALLENGES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Snow accumulations over lower elevation areas in the interior.</li></ul>	
<b>ADDITIONAL INFORMATION</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Brief snowfall rates up to 1 inch per hour possible.</li><li>▪ Mainly rain is expected in the coastal plain from Boston to Providence.</li><li>▪ Precip may begin as brief snow or rain/snow mix from Boston to north shore.</li></ul>	
<b>POST-EVENT OUTLOOK</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Low temps dropping into the upper 20s to lower 30s Mon night.</li><li>▪ Mainly dry and seasonable Tue with highs upper 30s to lower 40s</li></ul>
