

OVERVIEW:

- A long-duration storm will bring widespread heavy rain and high elevation snow late Thursday into Friday
- A Winter Storm Watch remains in effect for the Berkshires for the potential of 4 to 8 inches of wet snow, with locally higher amounts.

TIMING

 Heaviest snow expected overnight Thursday into early Friday morning, for locations mainly above 1500 ft in elevation.

HAZARDS & **IMPACTS**

■ 4-8 inches of snow possible in the Berkshires, with locally higher amounts. 3-4 inches possible for the northern Worcester Hills.

Snow will be heavy and wet so some power outages are possible.

NWS ALERTS

A Winter Storm Watch remains in effect for the Berkshires from 8 PM Thursday to 8 PM Friday.

• A Gale Watch remains in effect for the eastern waters on Friday.

FORECAST CHALLENGES


Areal coverage and amount of accumulating snow. While the best chance for accumulating snow is in the Berkshires mainly above 1500 ft, the Worcester hills and even some lower elevations of western and Central MA may see light accumulating snow.

Snow tapers off into showers by late Friday morning, possibly POST-EVENT OUTLOOK lingering into late Fri/early Sat.
