

- Elca ovnoctod
- Elsa expected to pass near or over southeast New England on Friday as a tropical storm
- Flash flooding is possible across much of southern New England due to heavy rainfall.
- Damaging winds and power outages are possible where Tropical Storm Warnings have been issued.
- Potential for dangerous marine conditions along with rough surf and rip currents along south coastal beaches
- No coastal/storm surge flooding expected

#### **Tropical Storm Elsa**



NOTE: Do not focus on the exact track.

Impacts can occur well outside the area enclosed by the cone.


- No major changes to the track
- A Tropical Storm Warning is now in effect as far north as the Merrimack and this includes to the Boston to Providence corridor.

## Wind Threat / Potential Impact

**Tropical Storm Elsa** 




#### There is a potential for:

- The risk for power outages is highest along the south coast, including Cape Cod and the Islands due to damaging winds
- There is a lower risk of wind damage and power outages from the Providence to Boston corridor



## Tropical Storm Wind Speed Probabilities

**Tropical Storm Elsa** 




- Roughly 2 in 10 chance of winds reaching tropical storm force (sustained 40 mph) on Nantucket.
- Only 1 in 10 chance of tropical storm force winds across Rhode Island and southeast Massachusetts
- Tropical Storm Force gusts up to 50 mph are more likely in the warning area



#### Earliest Reasonable Time of Arrival

**Tropical Storm Elsa** 




- The earliest reasonable time of arrival of tropical storm force winds, if they were to occur, would be Friday morning
- Period of strongest winds will only be about 8 hours



## Expected Storm Total Rainfall

**Tropical Storm Elsa** 




- Rain totals of 2-4 inches with isolated amounts up to 6 inches are possible.
- A Flash Flood Watch has been issued for much of southern New England.
- The graphic on the left shows the storm total rainfall valid from Thursday morning through Saturday morning
- Locally, most rain will occur on Friday



#### Tornado Potential


#### **Tropical Storm Elsa**



 Main threat of tornadoes would be Friday morning into the afternoon



Confidence is HIGH that the event will occur Confidence is MODERATE regarding impacts



Potential for south/southeast wind gusts up to 50 mph, mainly south/east of Elsa's track. Greatest chances are in Rhode Island and southeast Massachusetts.



No coastal flooding anticipated



Heavy rain expected north/west of Elsa's track. This may lead to flash flooding.



Dangerous marine conditions expected across the coastal waters, especially around and south of the Cape and Islands. Potential for rough surf and rip currents, especially along the south coasts of RI and MA, which could linger into Saturday.
