



## OVERVIEW:

- Cold front will bring a chance for severe storms late today into tonight, moving in from eastern NY and southern VT.
- Greatest risk is across northern & western MA into northwestern CT. A more limited/lesser risk exists across remaining portions of CT, RI and MA.

<b>TIMING</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 4 PM to 10 PM</li> </ul>
<b>HAZARDS &amp; IMPACTS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Damaging wind gusts may take down trees and limbs</li> <li>▪ Heavy rain may result in localized flooding, especially in urban and poor drainage areas</li> <li>▪ Low probability of large hail and an isolated tornado in strongest storms</li> </ul>
<b>FORECAST CHALLENGES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Thunderstorm timing</li> <li>▪ Areal coverage &amp; intensity of evening storms: weakening trends likely as storms near the Hartford to Boston corridor, but a couple strong storms still possible?</li> </ul>
<b>POST-EVENT OUTLOOK</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Unsettled; rain chances everyday through Saturday.</li> <li>▪ Seasonable temps in the 70s to near 80</li> </ul>
<b>NEXT BRIEFING</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Final, unless significant changes.</li> </ul>
