


OVERVIEW:

- A coastal storm system will bring a prolonged period of rain, heavy at times, as well as the potential for flooding, damaging winds, and minor coastal flooding and erosion.
- Confidence in areal extent of details remains uncertain; Highest confidence in strong winds across southeastern MA.

TIMING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Heaviest rain Monday night through Wednesday. ▪ Strongest winds early Tuesday into early Wednesday 	
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Heavy rainfall as much as 3-6 inches with locally higher amounts. ▪ Urban street flooding and river/small stream flooding possible ▪ Damaging winds. Power outages possible. 	
NWS ALERTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ High wind watch for eastern MA and RI 8am Tuesday - 2pm Wednesday 	
FORECAST CHALLENGES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ There remains uncertainty on the track of the system. This will determine who sees the greatest rainfall and the areal extent of strong winds. ▪ Highest confidence in strong winds across southeastern MA. 	
ADDITIONAL INFORMATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Astronomical tides are low, but the duration of E/NE flow will contribute to minor coastal flood and erosion potential. ▪ Wind damage may be exacerbated by nearly fully leafed trees, while clogged storm drains will be a concern for flooding.
