



What Has Changed?

- ✓ Conversion of Watches to Warnings/Advisories
- ✓ Increased winds/wind gusts.
- ✓ Updated rainfall totals.









Main Points

Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Strong Winds	Tree and powerline damage Possible power outages. Greater tree damage potential given fully leafed trees & wet ground.	Mainly eastern CT, central and eastern MA, RI, Cape Cod and the Islands.	Strongest winds Tuesday night into Wednesday. Easing later Wednesday.
Heavy Rain	Difficult travel during commutes. Urban and poor drainage flooding. Rises on rivers and streams at or over bankfull.	All of Southern New England.	Rain begins tonight. Heaviest rain potential Tuesday evening into early Wednesday morning.
Coastal Flooding	Minor coastal flooding on vulnerable shoreline roads. Up to 1 ft of inundation above ground level expected. Beach erosion.	Eastern MA coasts.	Morning and late afternoon Wednesday High Tides. Beach erosion: Tuesday afternoon into early Wednesday.










Forecast Storm Total Precipitation










Excessive Rainfall Outlooks – Day 2








Forecast Maximum Sustained Winds






Forecast Maximum Wind Gusts






Forecast Maximum Wave Heights

Maximum Wave Height

Valid: 10/25/2021 09:00 PM - 10/27/2021 08:00 PM EDT





- Northeast gusts increase midafternoon Tuesday to gale/low end storm force.
- Peak gusts to storm force expected Tuesday night into early Wednesday.
- Decreasing northeast gusts to gale force Wednesday late afternoon.
- Waves become rough and build to around 10 ft near shore, 20-25 ft offshore. Lower seas in the bays.

Coastal Flooding – Surge / Inundation



Minor

Minor Coastal Flooding

- Partial inundation within the flood zone, especially for low-lying areas.
- Vulnerable shore roads with up to a foot of water inundation possible. May be flooding of a few vulnerable basements.
- Some beach erosion with heavy surf Tuesday Night/Wed.

Timing

Minor Coastal flooding for both early morning and afternoon high tides Wed.; beach erosion Tuesday Nite – Wed nite.

	Storm Surge Threat	Potential Impacts from Storm Surge
Little to None	0 to 1 feet above ground	No immediate preparations needed. Little to no potential storm surge flooding impacts
Elevated	1 to 3 feet above ground	To be safe, prepare for the potential of limited storm surge flooding impacts
Moderate	3 to 6 feet above ground	To be safe, earnestly prepare for the potential of significant storm surge flooding impacts
High	6 to 9 feet above ground	To be safe, aggressively prepare for the potential of significant storm surge flooding impacts
Extreme	> 9 feet above ground	To be safe, aggressively prepare for the potential of devastating to catastrophic storm surge flooding impacts











Threat Event Summary

- ✓ Confidence: Moderate to high on winds; moderate on rain & coastal flooding
- ✓ What:



Strong to damaging winds Tue Nite – Wed.



Heavy rain capable of minor urban/poor drainage flooding.



Minor coastal flooding for both high tides Wed; moderate to significant beach erosion.

✓ Where: All of Southern New England

✓ When: Tuesday into much of Wednesday


