
OVERVIEW:

- Accumulating snow today for Cape Cod and the Islands
- Snow amounts of 2-6 inches with the highest totals over Nantucket
- Minor coastal flooding along the entire eastern MA coastline, due to high astronomical tides, a modest storm surge & waves

| TIMING | <ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Light snow begins mid to late morning▪ Steadiest & heaviest snow falls this afternoon & early evening▪ Snow ends approximately 7 pm to 10 pm from west to east |
| HAZARDS & IMPACTS | <ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Slippery travel as roads become snow covered and gusty winds▪ Minor flooding midday on typically vulnerable eastern MA shoreline roads |
| NWS ALERTS | <ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Winter Storm Warning issued for Nantucket▪ Winter Weather Advisory issued for Block Island, Martha's Vineyard & Cape Cod▪ Coastal Flood Advisory issued for the entire eastern MA coastline |
| FORECAST CHALLENGES | <ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ How far north will accumulating snow occur? As of now that line appears to be located somewhere along the immediate south coast▪ However, even a small shift in the storm track will have a large impact on snow totals from south to north. Therefore, it's possible the snow map below may need to be updated later this morning. Stay tuned! |
| POST-EVENT OUTLOOK | <ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Dry but cold weather later tonight into Tuesday morning. |
| NEXT BRIEFING | <ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ This will be the last briefing unless the forecast changes |
