

WEATHER FORECAST OFFICE

OVERVIEW:

- High confidence in accumulating snow, but amounts and westward extent remain uncertain very late Thursday night into Friday
- Friday morning rush hour will likely be impacted

TIMING	▪ Very late Thursday night into Friday	
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ The combination of snow and reduced visibility would result in hazardous travel that would impact the Friday AM commute▪ Temperatures will be cold enough that snow will stick immediately on untreated paved surfaces	
NWS ALERTS	▪ None at this time.	
FORECAST CHALLENGES	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Still some uncertainty with respect to the storm track - this will dictate amounts and westward extent of them▪ Precipitation Type issues confined to mainly the Cape/Islands with all snow elsewhere	
ADDITIONAL INFORMATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Generally 3-6 inches of snow expected for eastern MA and RI, with locally higher amounts possible.▪ Generally 2-4 inches expected for CT and the areas west of Worcester	
POST-EVENT OUTLOOK	▪ Dry, but very cold and blustery Friday night into Saturday
