

Winter Storm For Friday



WEATHER FORECAST OFFICE

OVERVIEW:

- Precipitation starts as moderate to heavy snow during the pre-dawn hours, then changes to a wintry mix south of the Mass Pike.
- 8-12 inches of snow north of the Pike, 4-8 inches south of the Pike, 3-6 inches of snow/sleet along the south coast into Cape Cod.
- Flash freeze potential for southeast MA and RI late in the day.

TIMING	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Beginning Friday pre-dawn hours▪ Tapering off Friday Evening into Friday Night	
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Friday morning commute will be impacted, and possibly evening commute.▪ Snowfall rates of 1 to 2 inches per hour will be likely for a period of time, coinciding with the Friday morning commute.▪ Potential for flash freeze across southeast MA and RI late afternoon into evening as above freezing temperatures fall back into the 20s.	
NWS ALERTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Winter Storm Warnings north of the Mass Pike.▪ Winter Storm Watches continue for northern CT, RI and southeast MA.▪ Winter Weather Advisories for southern CT.	
FORECAST CHALLENGES	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Uncertainty in timing of changeover from heavy snow to wintry mix▪ A second period of snow later Friday afternoon/evening, especially across Central/Eastern MA and RI.▪ Flash freeze potential across southeast MA and RI later in the day.	
POST-EVENT OUTLOOK	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Below normal temperatures. Lows mainly 10-20 Friday night. Highs in the 30s Saturday. Dry weather expected this weekend.
