## Winter Storm For Friday



## **OVERVIEW:**

- Precipitation starts as moderate to heavy snow during the pre-dawn hours, then changes to a wintry mix south of the Mass Pike.
- 8-12 inches of snow north of the Pike, 4-8 inches south of the Pike, including CT & RI, 2-5 inches along the south coast to Cape Cod.
- Flash freeze potential for eastern MA and RI late Fri/Fri evening.

FORECAST CHALLENGES	<ul> <li>Uncertainty in timing of changeover from heavy snow to wintry mix</li> <li>A second period of snow later Friday afternoon/evening, especially across Central/Eastern MA and RI.</li> <li>Flash freeze potential across southeast MA and RI later in the day.</li> </ul>
