- A strong storm system will bring strong winds, wind-driven heavy rain, with accumulating wet snow above 1500 ft late tonight into Tue AM.
- Splashover or minor coastal flooding along vulnerable shoreline roads in south coastal CT & eastern MA with morning high tide.

- High Wind Warning for Cape Cod and Islands. • Wind Advisory for southern CT & RI, eastern MA and Northern & Southern
- Winter Weather Advisory for the Berkshires. Coastal Flood Warning for southern Fairfield in CT.
- Coastal Flood Advisory for New Haven in CT.
