


OVERVIEW:

- A line of strong to severe thunderstorms are possible Monday Evening as a cold front sweeps through New England
- Isolated damaging wind gusts will be the primary threat
- Storms are anticipated to be strongest over western MA & CT, weakening as they move east after sunset

TIMING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Strongest storms anticipated between 5 & 9pm; earlier west. Scattered rain showers through midnight as storms weaken and move east. 	
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Isolated damaging wind gusts. Gusts exceeding 58 mph possible, most likely across the Connecticut River Valley ▪ Localized downpours in heavier thunderstorms leading to street and poor drainage flooding in typical locations 	
NWS ALERTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ No watches have been issued at this time. 	
FORECAST CHALLENGES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Timing of the cold front, exact location of strong to severe storms 	
POST-EVENT OUTLOOK	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Brief cool down to seasonable conditions, upper 60s and low 70s, mid week. Heat returns next weekend with highs in the upper 80s and 90s expected Friday and Saturday. ▪ Dry conditions expected all week.
