

OVERVIEW:

- A few strong thunderstorms could produce damaging wind or hail Saturday afternoon

TIMING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Main risk for stronger thunderstorms from Noon to 6 PM.
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Localized damaging wind gusts could produce isolated tree/powerline damage Hail is also possible in the stronger storms
NWS ALERTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> None at this time
FORECAST CHALLENGES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Strength and coverage of t-storms will depend on how much sunshine develops and how warm it can get by early afternoon.
ADDITIONAL INFORMATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> NWS Storm Prediction Center has highlighted areas along and west of I-95 in a Marginal Risk for Severe Weather (image below). This is the lowest risk level
POST-EVENT OUTLOOK	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Heat and humidity builds Sunday into Memorial Day. No rain is expected either day.
